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## **Executive Summary**

The following analysis is the first in a series of reports examining shooting incidents, victims, and suspects in the State of Delaware. Prior reports by the Criminal Justice Council focused exclusively on shootings in Wilmington, Delaware. This report shows that while Wilmington was responsible for more than half of all reported shootings in the state in 2011, suburban New Castle County and Kent County also reported a significant number of shootings that year.

In 2011, 149 shooting incidents were reported in Delaware. These shootings resulted in the injury or death of 158 victims. Over half (58.2 percent) of the 158 shooting victims were shot in Wilmington, 25.3 percent were shot in suburban New Castle County, 12 percent were shot in Kent County, and 4.4 percent were shot in Sussex County. Twenty-nine (18.4 percent) of the 158 shooting victims died from their injuries.

210 suspects were implicated in the 149 shooting incidents either by the victims themselves, by witnesses to the shooting, or through police investigations. As of April 2012, 73 suspects have been identified by name, race and sex, and 50 suspects were arrested. The identities of 137 of the 210 shooting suspects were unknown and 48 suspects were convicted as of April 2012.

Of the 71 identified shooting suspects, 85.9 percent were under 30, and over half (53.5 percent) were between the ages of 18 and 25 years old. 91.5 percent of the 71 identified shooting suspects were male. Black males comprised 84.5 percent of all identified shooting suspects. In comparison, half (50 percent) of the 158 shooting victims were over 25 years old, and 43 percent were between the ages of 18 and 25 years old. 89.2 percent of the 158 shooting victims were males of any race, and 75.3 percent of shooting victims were black males. Black male victims were shot by black male suspects in 79.5 percent of cases where both the race and sex of the suspect and victim were known.

85.9 percent of the 71 known suspects and 70.9 percent of victims had prior arrest histories in Delaware. Compared with shooting victims, suspects were more likely to have a prior violent felony arrest in their criminal history, were more likely to have been arrested as a juvenile, and were more likely to be eligible for career criminal status.

## **Methodology**

The data presented in this report were obtained from DELJIS (Delaware Justice Information System) records, and were acquired by downloading assault and homicide complaint records, and filtering for incidents where a firearm was used and a shot was discharged. Each remaining record was researched individually to verify that every incident included at least one victim who was injured or killed by a firearm. Suspect and victim demographics, arrest history, career criminal status, and shooting incident location.



## Shooting Incidents, Victims, and Suspects

Police agencies in Delaware reported 149 shooting incidents in 2011 that resulted in the injury or death of the victim. The total number of incidents, victims, and suspects are shown in Table 1. It should be noted that the totals shown do not include self-inflicted shootings, accidental shootings, or shootings that were committed in self-defense.

More than half of all shootings reported in Delaware in 2011 occurred in Wilmington. Police in Wilmington reported 87 (58.4 percent) of the 149 shooting incidents reported statewide in 2011. Police agencies in suburban New Castle county accounted for 36 (24.2 percent) of the 149 shootings statewide. Overall, 123 (82.6 percent) of the 149 shooting incidents reported in Delaware in 2011 were from New Castle County. Kent and Sussex counties accounted for 19 (12.8 percent) and 7 (4.7 percent) shooting incidents respectively.

158 shooting victims in Delaware were injured or killed by firearms in 2011. A review of police incident reports shows that 208 suspects were involved in the 149 shootings shown in Table 1. As of April 2012, 71 (34.1 percent) of the 208 suspected shooters were identified by name, race, sex and birth date, and 48 suspects (23.1 percent) have been arrested.

Shootings in 2011 that resulted in the death of the victim are shown in Table 2. Twenty-nine of the 158 shooting victims succumbed of their injuries in 25 separate incidents, not including self-inflicted shootings. Sixteen (64 percent) of the 25 fatal shooting incidents occurred in Wilmington and 5 fatal incidents (20 percent) were in suburban New Castle County. Overall, 84 percent of all fatal shooting incidents in 2011 occurred in New Castle County with the remaining 4 fatal shootings (16 percent) taking place in Kent County.

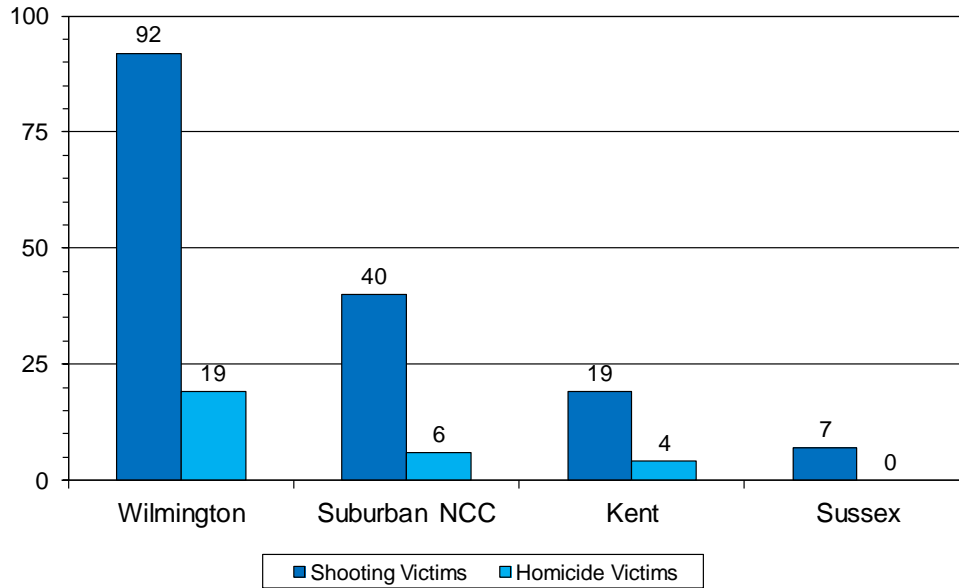
Twenty-five of the 29 reported shooting fatalities were shot in New Castle County. Nineteen (65.5 percent) of the 29 fatal shooting victims were shot in Wilmington, 6 (20.7 percent) were shot in suburban New Castle County, and 4 (13.8 percent) were shot in Kent County. Nineteen (52.8 percent) of the 36 firearm homicide suspects were identified by name, race, sex, and birth date. Sixteen (44.4 percent) suspects have been arrested as of April 2012.

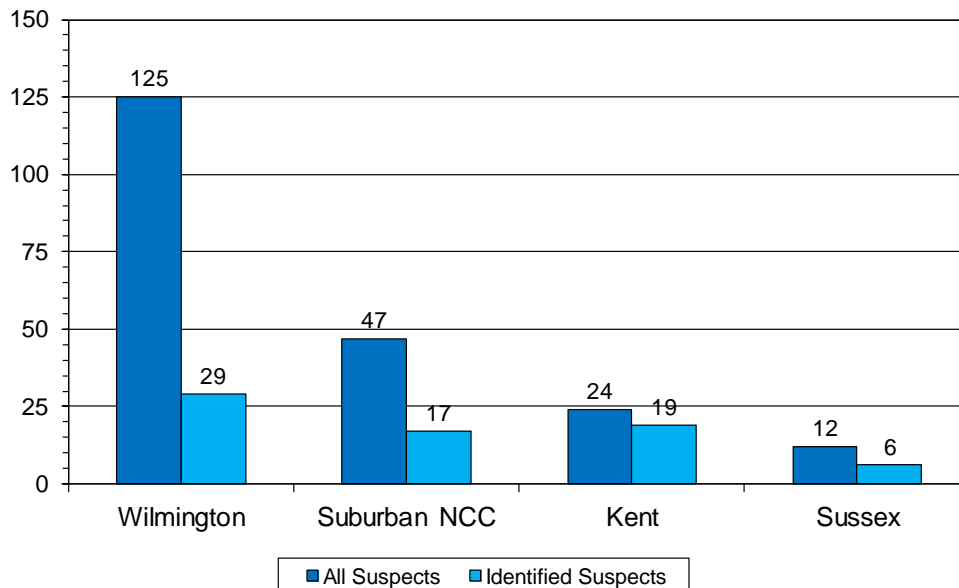
Table 3 shows the case status and dispositions for the 48 arrested shooting suspects. As of April 2012, 14 cases resulted in a conviction, 2 cases were dismissed, and the defendant was found not guilty in one case.

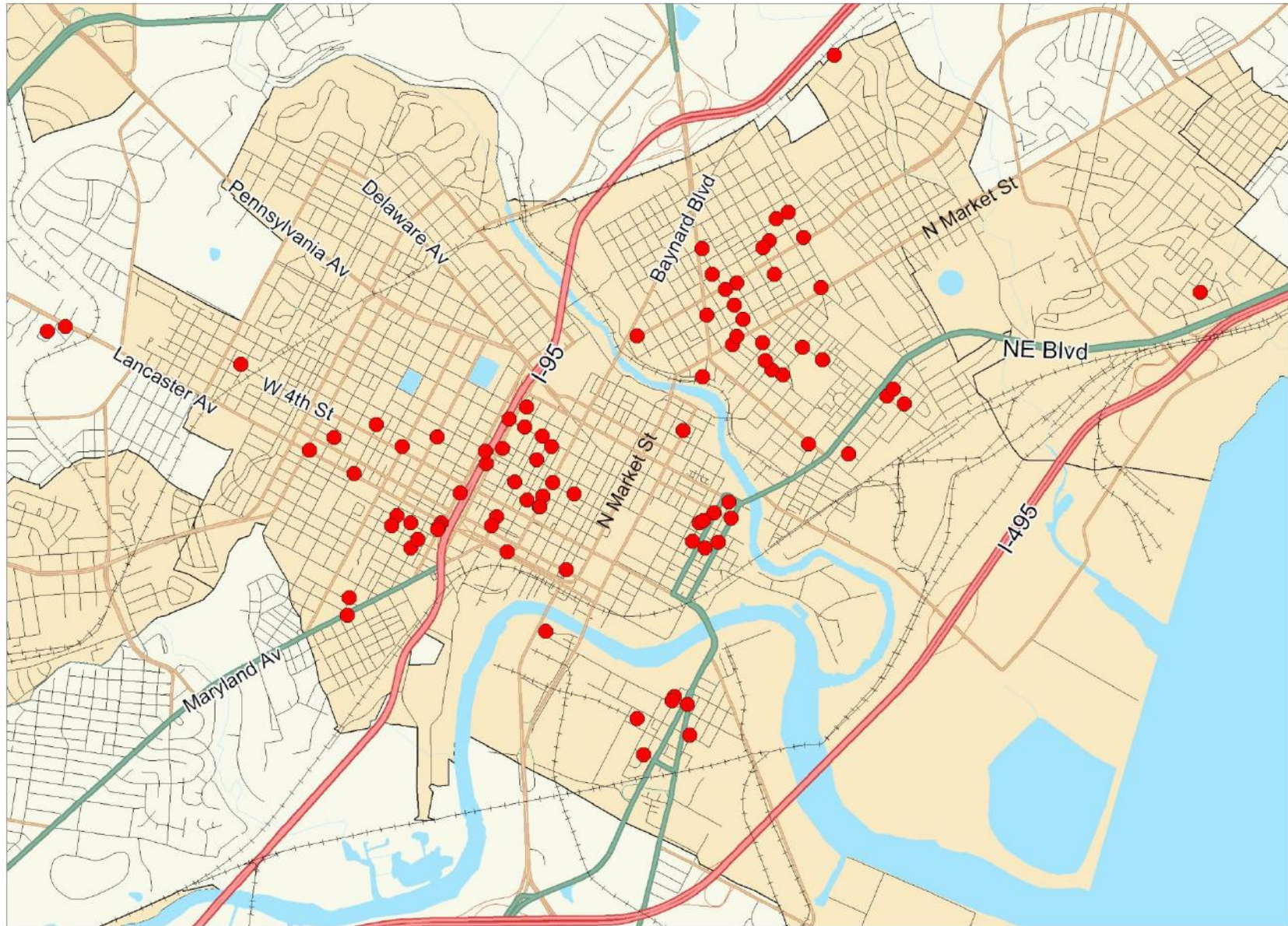
# Delaware Shooting Locations in 2011



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# Delaware Shooting Locations in 2011 - Wilmington



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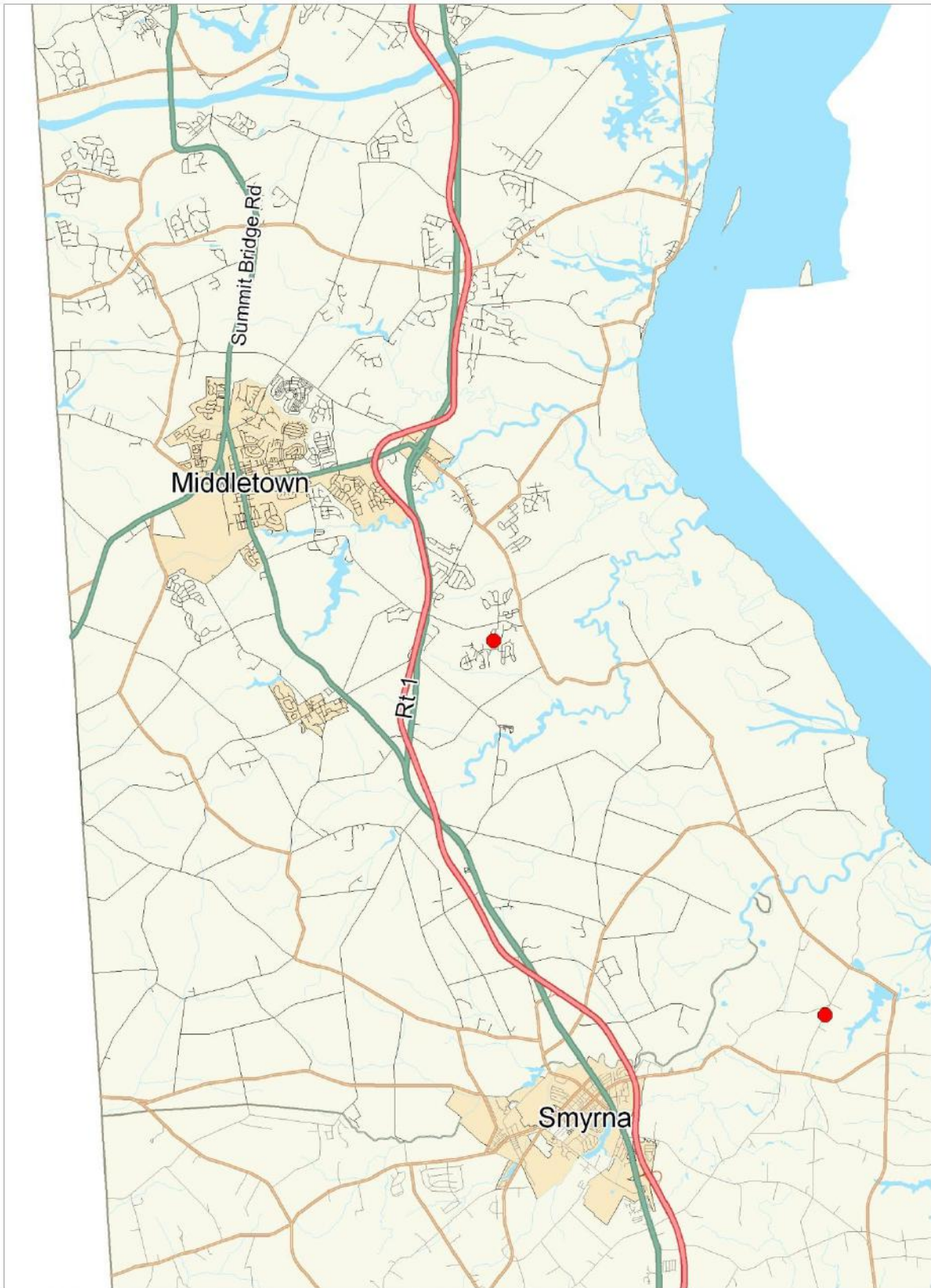
# Delaware Shooting Locations in 2011 - Northern New Castle County

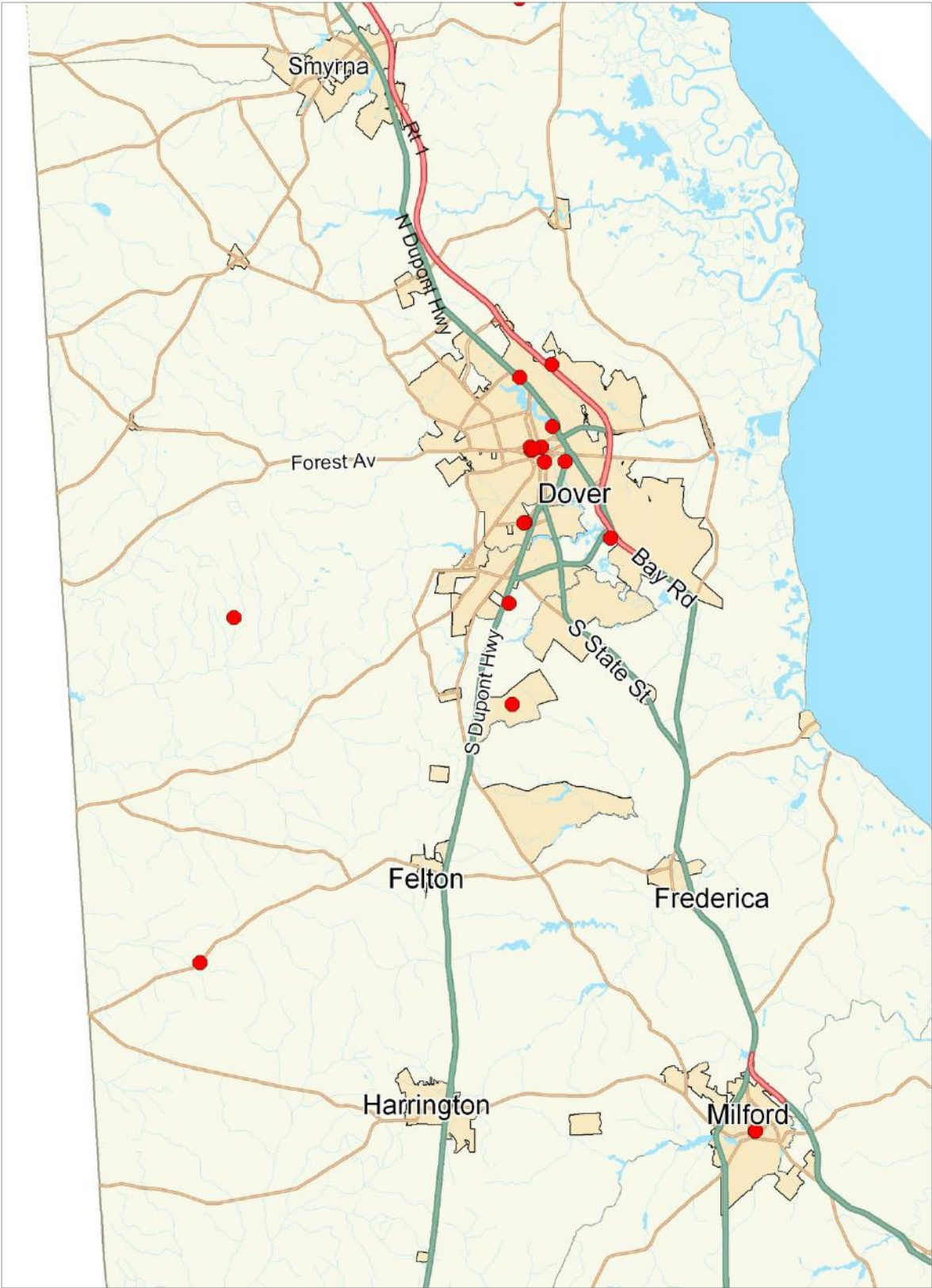


# Delaware Shooting Locations in 2011 - Lower New Castle County

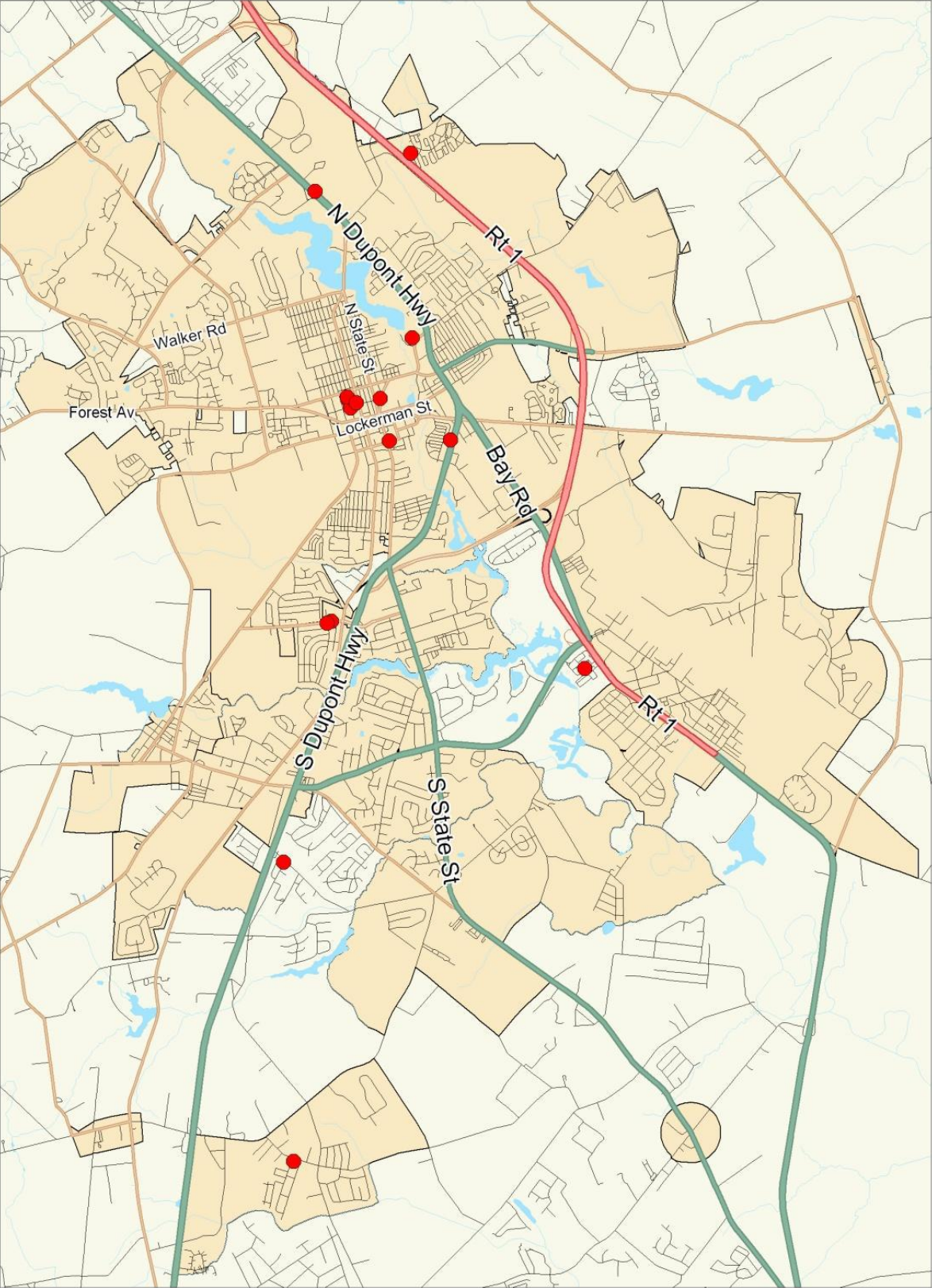
# Delaware Shooting Locations in 2011 - Kent County

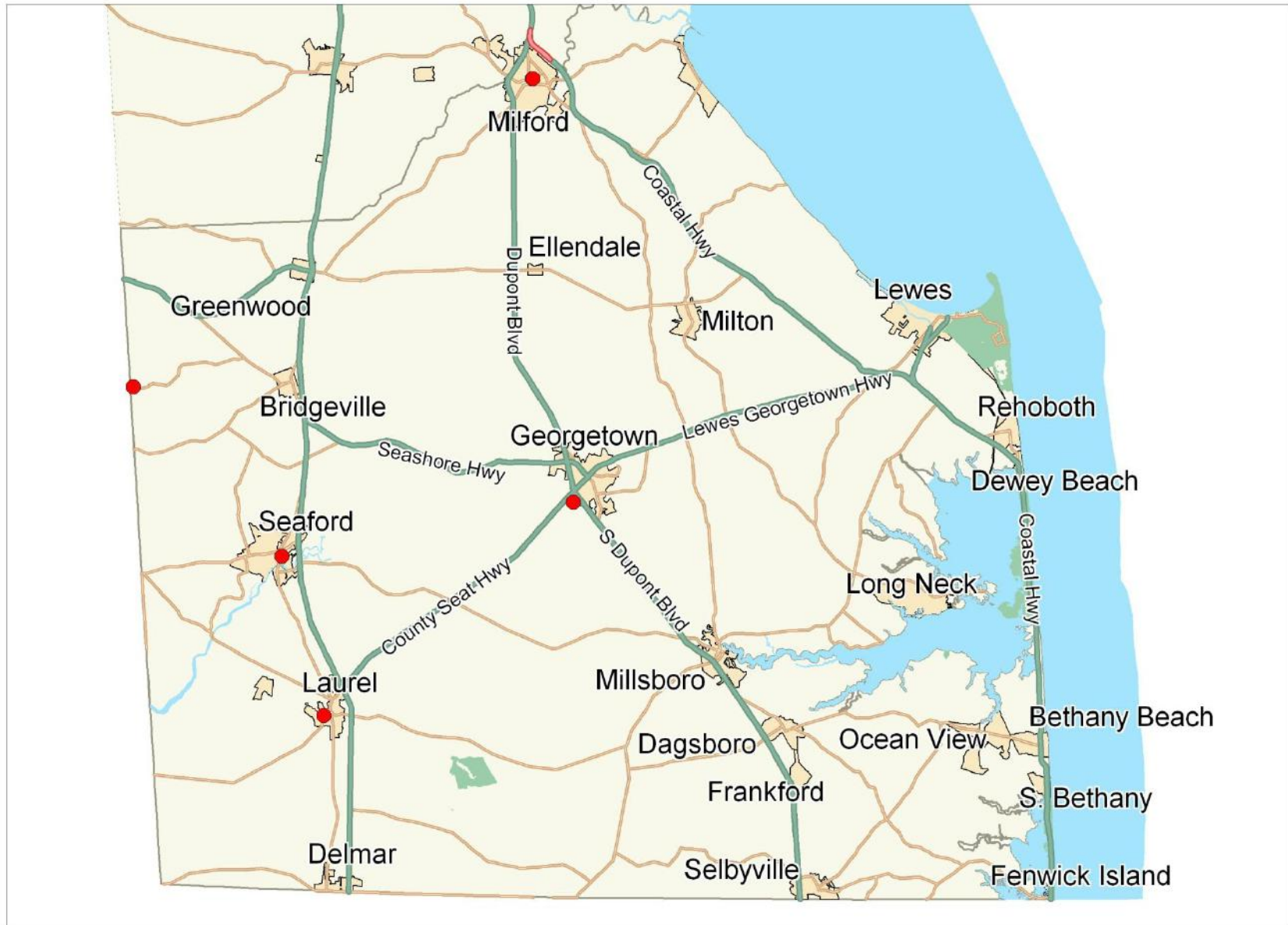


# Delaware Shooting Locations in 2011 - Dover

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## Shooting Suspect and Victim Demographics

Race, sex, and age information for 71 known shooting suspects are shown in Table 5. More than half (53.5 percent) of the 71 identified shooting suspects were between the ages of 18 and 25 years old, 38 percent were older than 25 years old, and 8.5 percent were younger than 18 years old. Black males comprised 84.5 percent of all shooting suspects.

Shooting suspect demographics are shown in Table 6. Fifty percent of the 158 shooting suspects were adults older than 25 years old, 43 percent were between the ages of 18 and 25 years old, and 6.9 percent were younger than 18 years old. 75.3 percent of the 158 shooting victims reported statewide in 2011 were black males.

In 2011, 71 known shooting suspects shot 158 victims. Four of the identified suspects shot more than one victim. Table 7 compares the age range of known shooting suspects with the ages of their victims. In cases where both the suspect and victim ages were known, 25.3 percent of shooting victims were shot by suspects who were approximately the same age as they were.

## Criminal Histories of Shooting Suspects and Victims

Table 9 summarizes the criminal arrest histories for 2011 shooting suspects and victims. 85.9 percent of known shooting suspects and 70.9 percent of shooting victims had an arrest history in Delaware. A higher percentage of shooting suspects had prior misdemeanor, drug, weapon, felony or violent felony offenses in their arrest histories compared to shooting victims.

Table 10 compares the age at first criminal justice system contact for shooting suspects and victims. The table shows that 80.3 percent of shooting suspects and 71.4 percent of shooting victims were juveniles at the time of their first arrest in Delaware.

The Career Criminal Candidate status of known shooting suspects and victims are shown in Table 11. 59.2 percent of known shooting suspects and 27.8 percent of shooting victims were eligible for career criminal status as of April 2012.

## Day and Time Analysis of Shootings in Delaware 2011

Table 12 shows the date and times that shooting victims were shot. The most common day of the week that victims were shot was Sunday, and the most common times were between 6:00 p.m. and 12 a.m..

## Victim Injuries, Suspect Motives, and Victim-Offender Relationships

Table 13 shows the areas of the body where shooting victims were hit by gunfire. Approximately one-quarter of all shooting victims were shot in the legs, groin, or buttocks and one out of every five shooting victims were shot in the abdomen, chest or back.

Table 14 shows the motives for shootings as described in arrest reports for the 48 arrested shooting suspects. According to the reports, the most common motives for shootings were fights or altercations that occurred between the victims and suspects immediately prior to the shooting. Fights or altercations were the motive in 28.2 percent of incidents. Robberies (including home invasions) were the motive in 27.1 percent of incidents, and disputes related to illicit drugs were the motive in 14.6 percent of incidents. The motives for the remaining 14 shootings were not described in the reports.

The relationships between shooting suspects and victims are shown in Table 15. The most commonly reported victim to offender relationship given by shooting victims was Acquaintance (33.3 percent), followed by Stranger (18.8 percent), and Otherwise Known (12.5 percent).

## Self-Inflicted and Self-Defense Shootings

In 2011, an additional 48 shooting injuries and fatalities in Delaware were either self-inflicted or occurred during an act of self-defense. Forty-six shootings were self-inflicted, of which 37 were intentional (suicides) and 9 were accidental. Shootings that were made in self-defense comprised the 2 remaining shootings.
