Crime in Delaware: 2011 – 2015 is the official report of serious crimes known to law enforcement from 2011 through 2015. The report provides extensive data about crime at the state and county levels. This supplement continues to reflect an evolving effort within the *Crime in Delaware* reporting process to provide extensive crime data about the City of Wilmington.

The methods used to prepare and analyze Wilmington’s data are the same as those described in the main *Crime in Delaware* report, with one exception: data for Wilmington’s two enforcement agencies—the Wilmington Police Department and the Wilmington Fire Marshall—were first merged before analyzing the city’s data.

In this supplement, tables and figures with summary level data about offenses, clearances, and arrests are presented first. These are followed by detailed data tables with counts of offenses, clearances, and adult and juvenile arrests (Tables 3 – 6). Summaries of key findings from each level of data are also included and precede the two sections.

Note to the reader

Data for a calendar year are not considered final for the purposes of the *Crime in Delaware* report until offense counts become sufficiently stable, usually 12 – 15 months after the end of that year. Therefore, final data are provided for the 2011 – 2014 period and preliminary data for 2015. To illustrate long term trends, final data for the years 2004 through 2010 are included in the figures.

Wilmington Serious Crime At-a-Glance 2011 – 2015

Overall, 1,572 fewer Group A offenses were reported in Wilmington in 2014 compared to 2011, a decline of 11.5%. Preliminary data for 2015 suggest an additional decline of about 600 offenses (see Table 1 and Figure 1). All major crime categories were lower in 2014 compared to 2011, with the greatest declines for Drug/Narcotic Offenses (38.7%) and Other Property and Social Offenses (11.2%). Violent Offenses and Serious Property Offenses declined during this period by 9.5% and 1.7%. Preliminary data for 2015 seems to show a growing decline in all offense categories except for Violent Offenses, which is showing about a 12% increase. Long term trends since 2004 can also be seen in Figure 1. The number of homicides in 2015 (27) matches last year and tied for the highest of the five year period.

The most frequently reported offenses in the city were Assault; Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property; Larceny; Drug/Narcotic; Burglary; and Weapon Law Violations. Assault, Drug Offenses, and Destruction/Damage/Vandalism showed distinct downward trends from 2004 to 2014, but Assault increased based upon preliminary data for 2015. The patterns for the other three offenses were more mixed but, overall, are flat or decreasing. Long term trends since 2004 can be seen in Figure 2.

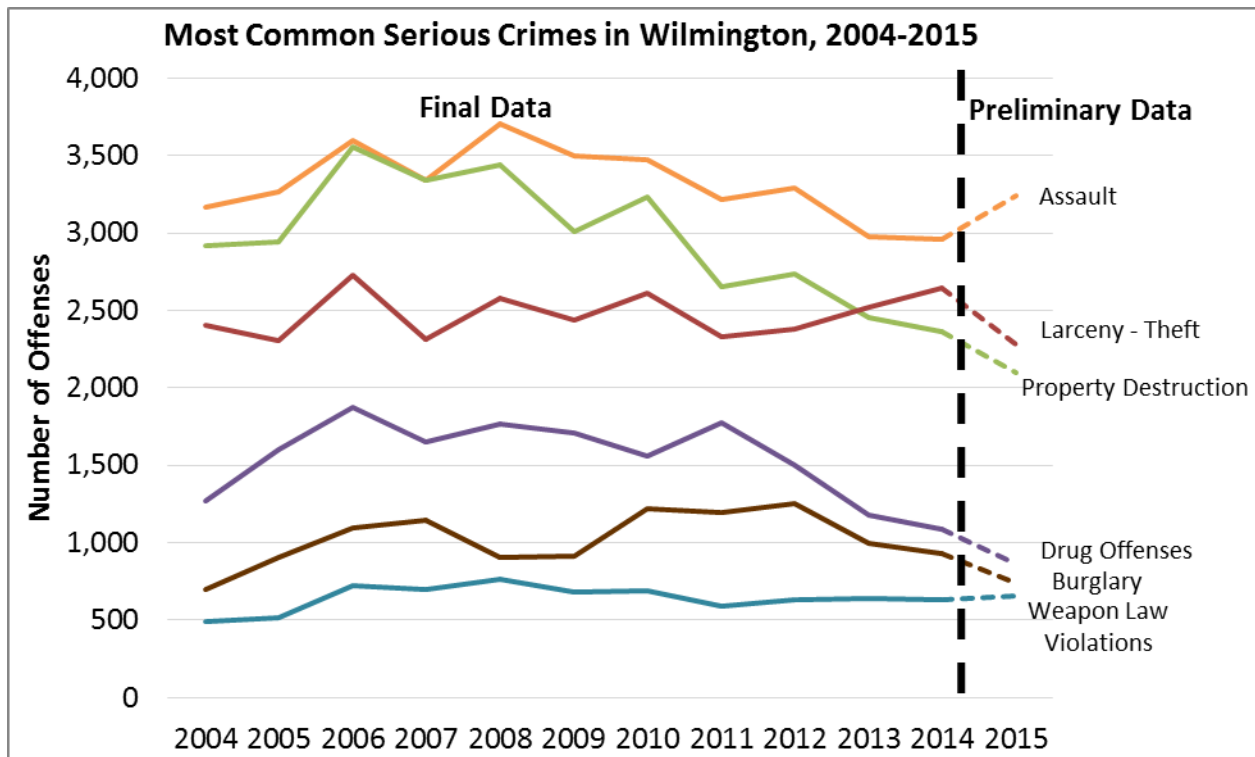
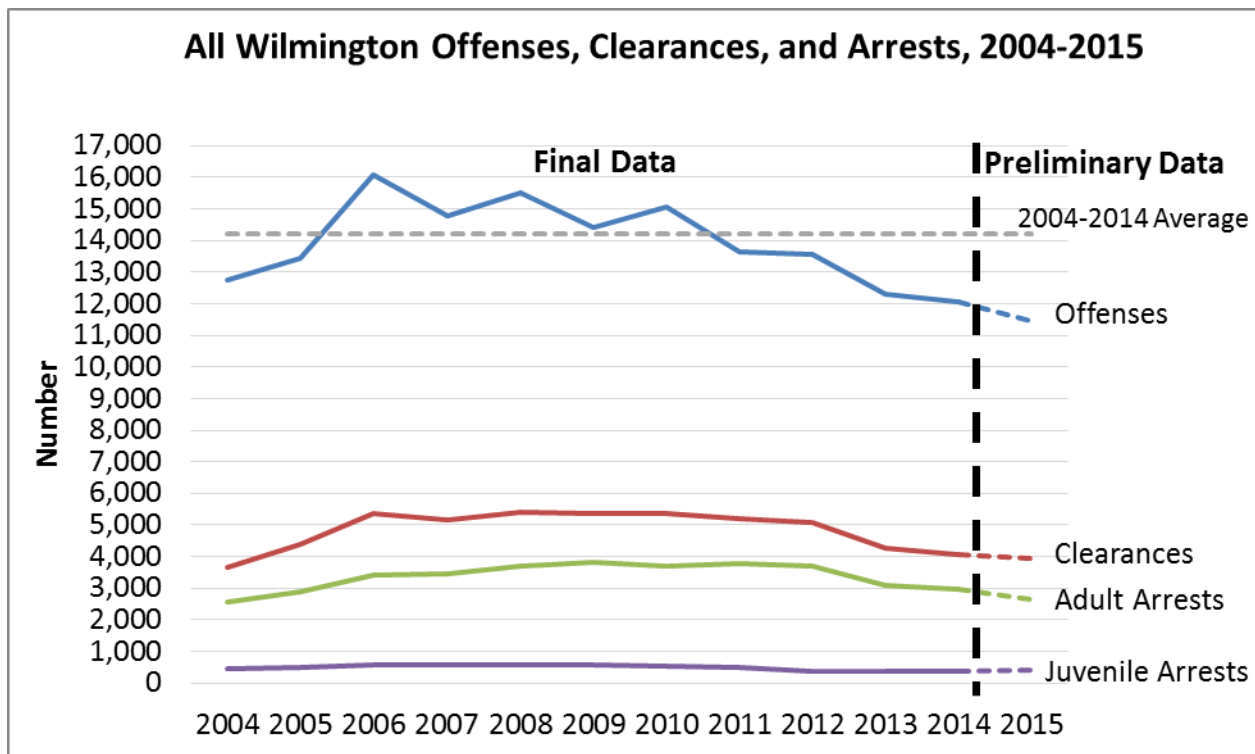


Figure 3: All Wilmington Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2004 – 2015

Based on 2015 preliminary data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates generally comparable to the rates from 2011 through 2014 (see Table 1 and Figure 3). Overall, about one-third of all offenses committed in 2015 were cleared by the end of the calendar year. One area of special note is the increased clearance rate of criminal homicides. Long term clearance trends can also be seen in Figure 3.

The number of juvenile arrests showed a downward trend during this period (about a 17% decrease overall) but experienced a 10% increase from 2014 to 2015. The number of total adult arrests was about 30% lower (see Table 2 and Figure 3). Long term trends in arrests can also be seen in Figure 3.

Figure 1: Serious Crime in Wilmington by Category, 2004 – 2015

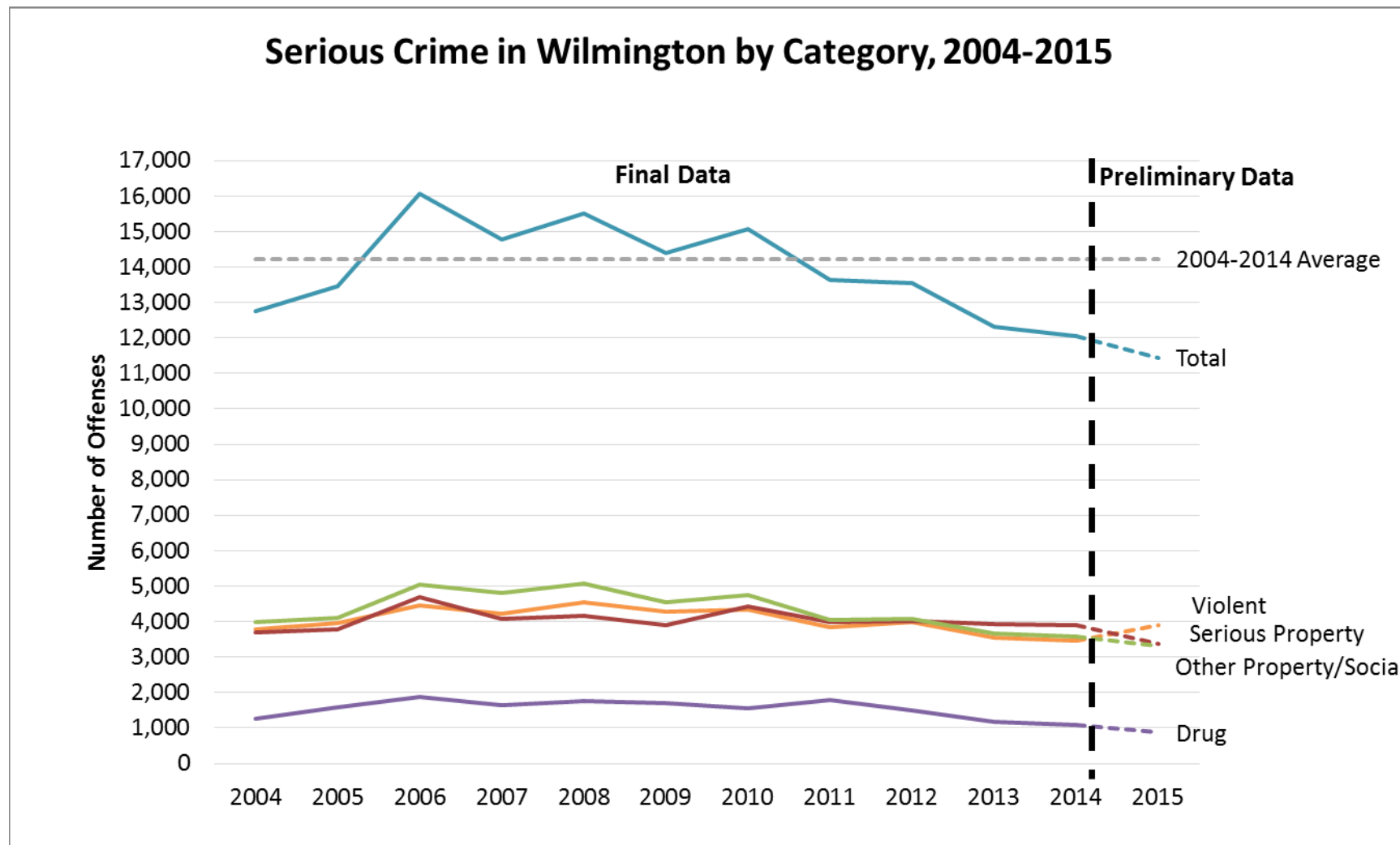

Figure 2: Most Common Serious Crimes in Wilmington, 2004 – 2015

A Detailed Look at Crime in Wilmington

The following section provides more detailed information about serious crime in Wilmington. Included is a summary of notable findings for specific crimes within the four crime categories (Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Serious Property Offenses) along with tables that provide detailed counts of offenses, clearances, and adult and juvenile arrests.

Notes to the Reader

Data for a calendar year are not considered final for the *Crime in Delaware* report until offense counts become sufficiently stable, usually 12 – 15 months after the end of that year. Therefore, final data are provided for the 2011 – 2014 period and preliminary data for 2015.

Graphic figures that incorporate final and preliminary data are include as appropriate to illustrate trends in the data.

Please use caution when comparing Wilmington's data to data for other jurisdictions and geographic areas. Crime data are best understood in the context of other data.

An important consideration to keep in mind:

- In drawing conclusions about changes between 2015 preliminary data and the final data from prior years, be aware that some crimes (e.g., Fraud, Forgery/Counterfeiting, Arson, Homicide) are more prone to delayed reporting to law enforcement agencies or the filing of charges than other crimes.

Violent Offenses

- The number of Criminal Homicides (27) matched 2014, tying the highest for the report period.
- Forcible Sex Offenses (a lower frequency crime) was about 52% higher in 2015 as compared to 2011, but about 300% higher compared to 2014.
- Assault and Robbery offenses were both almost even (0.7% and 1.5% increase) compared to 2011. Robbery showed an increase after a 3 year decline. Assaults were up from 2014 to 2015.
- Assault offenses that involved the use of firearm were about 66% higher in 2015 compared to 2011 and has shown a steady increase. Robbery offenses were about even during this period. Robbery with a Firearm are showing an increase, much like Assaults. While not reported in the NIBRS data, most criminal homicides in 2015 involved the use of a firearm.

Serious Property Offenses

- Burglary offenses were about 38% lower compared to 2011.
- The number of all Larceny offenses was down about 2%, with a noticeable decrease from 2014 to 2015. Within that subcategory of crime:
 - The number of Theft from a Building offenses was about 12% lower than 2011 and the highest of the period.
 - The number of Theft from a Motor Vehicle offenses was about 24% higher than 2011, but lower than 2013-2014 numbers.
- The number of Motor Vehicle Theft offenses was down about 20% compared to 2011.

Drug/Narcotic Offenses

- Overall, the number of offenses in this category in 2015 was about 51% lower than 2011. Drug Equipment offenses were about 69% lower during this period. Both totals reflected lows for the report period and are part of a long-term downward trend.

Other Property and Social Offenses

- The number of Fraud offenses was about 28% lower in 2015 compared to 2011. This decrease was largely driven by a substantial decline in Impersonation offenses (about 45%).
- The number of Destruction, Damage, Vandalism of Property offenses in 2015 was the lowest of the report period and reflects a steady 21% decrease since 2011.
- Weapon Law Violations were about 10% higher compared to 2011.
