Crime in Delaware: 2012 – 2016 is the official report of serious crimes known to law enforcement from 2012 through 2016. The report provides extensive data about crime at the state and county levels. This supplement continues to reflect an evolving effort within the *Crime in Delaware* reporting process to provide extensive crime data about the City of Wilmington.

The methods used to prepare and analyze Wilmington’s data are the same as those described in the main *Crime in Delaware* report, with one exception: data for Wilmington’s two enforcement agencies—the Wilmington Police Department and the Wilmington Fire Marshall—were first merged before analyzing the city’s data.

In this supplement, tables and figures with summary level data about offenses, clearances, and arrests are presented first. These are followed by detailed data tables with counts of offenses, clearances, and adult and juvenile arrests (Tables 3 – 6). Summaries of key findings from each level of data are also included and precede the two sections.

Notes to the reader:

In previous reports, “Final” data was distinguished from “Preliminary” data due to the fact that offense totals tended to fluctuate, sometimes substantially, for 12-15 months after the end of a given reporting year. Since these fluctuations would otherwise distort the magnitude of any changes in crime when comparing data still considered to be volatile compared to data considered to be stable, a decision was made to compare final data to final data and preliminary data (not yet considered stable) to preliminary data.

However, in recent years, due to additional quality control work on the part of DELJIS and SBI, this fluctuation has diminished to less than 0.5% of total offenses. For reporting purposes, this level of fluctuation is considered to be inconsequential. Therefore, as of the 2016 reporting year, a decision was made to consider all data provided by SBI as “Final” data. However, the SAC will continue to monitor the level of data fluctuation each year and will adjust our reporting approach if data issues warrant it.

Drug Offense Changes

On June 18th, 2015, legislation was signed to change Delaware drug statutes that decriminalized the possession of small amounts of marijuana in certain situations. Depending on the circumstances surrounding the situation, possession of a small amount of marijuana is a civil violation rather than a criminal offense. This change, which went into effect on December 18th, 2015, could possibly have multiple impacts on the drug offense data contained within all of the *Crime in Delaware* reports. At this time it is too early to determine the impacts from this change but decreases in reported Group A offenses and arrests may be a possible set of outcomes.

Wilmington Serious Crime At-a-Glance 2012 – 2016

Overall, 1,660 fewer Group A offenses were reported in Wilmington in 2016 compared to 2012, a decline of 12.2%. However 2016 data indicate recent increase since 2015 after a long decline. (see Table 1 and Figure 1). All major crime categories were lower in 2016 compared to 2012, with the greatest declines for Drug/Narcotic Offenses (46%) and Other Property and Social Offenses (9.6%). Violent Offenses and Serious Property Offenses declined during this period by 6.8% and 7.7%. Long term trends since 2005 can also be seen in Figure 1A. Figure 1B also shows long term trends in a closer view to better understand the trends. The number of homicides in 2016 (28) is the highest in the five year report period.

The most frequently reported offenses in the city were Assault; Destruction, Damage, and Vandalism of Property; Larceny; Drug/Narcotic; Burglary; and Weapon Law Violations. Property Damage showed a marked increase from 2015 to 2016 after a long overall decline. Assault has a mixed trend since 2005. Drug Offenses continued a multiple year decline. The patterns for the other three offenses were more mixed. Long term trends since 2005 can be seen in Figure 2.

Based on 2016 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates generally comparable to the rates from 2012 through 2015 (see Table 1 and Figure 3). Drug offenses have been showing a small decline in clearance percentage over the past 5 years. Overall, about one-third of all offenses committed in 2016 were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Long term clearance trends can also be seen in Figure 3.

The number of juvenile arrests has shown a more mixed overall trend while adult arrests have been steadily decreasing since 2012 (30%). Coincidentally, total arrests for Drug offenses decreased 52.8%. This is similar to the overall state arrests trends and could be partially attributed to the marijuana possession statute changes that were referenced earlier that decriminalized marijuana possession in certain situations and circumstances. Long term trends in arrests can also be seen in Figure 3.

Figure 1A: Serious Crime in Wilmington by Category, 2005 – 2016

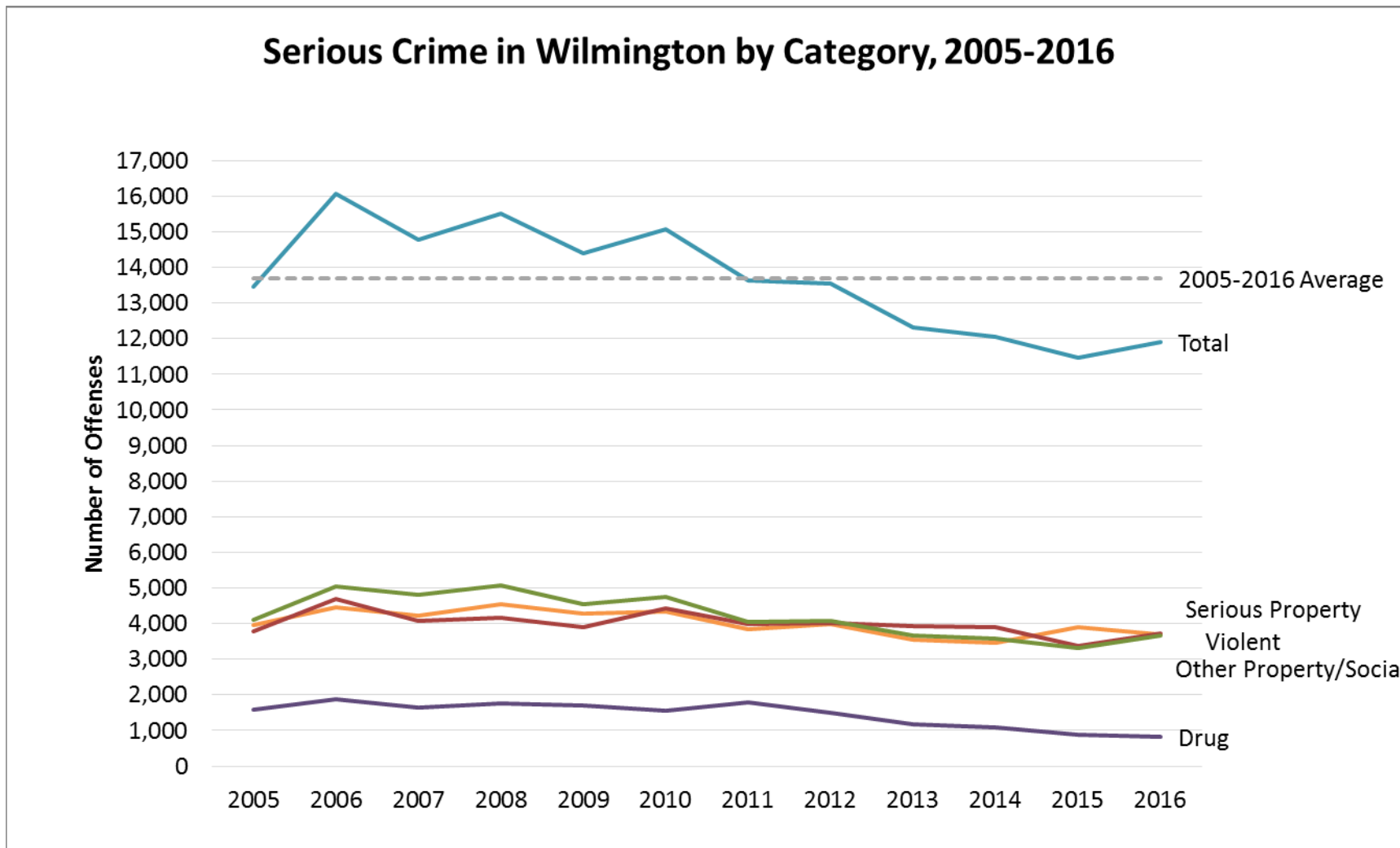


Figure 1B: Serious Crime in Wilmington by Category, 2005 – 2016 (Detailed)

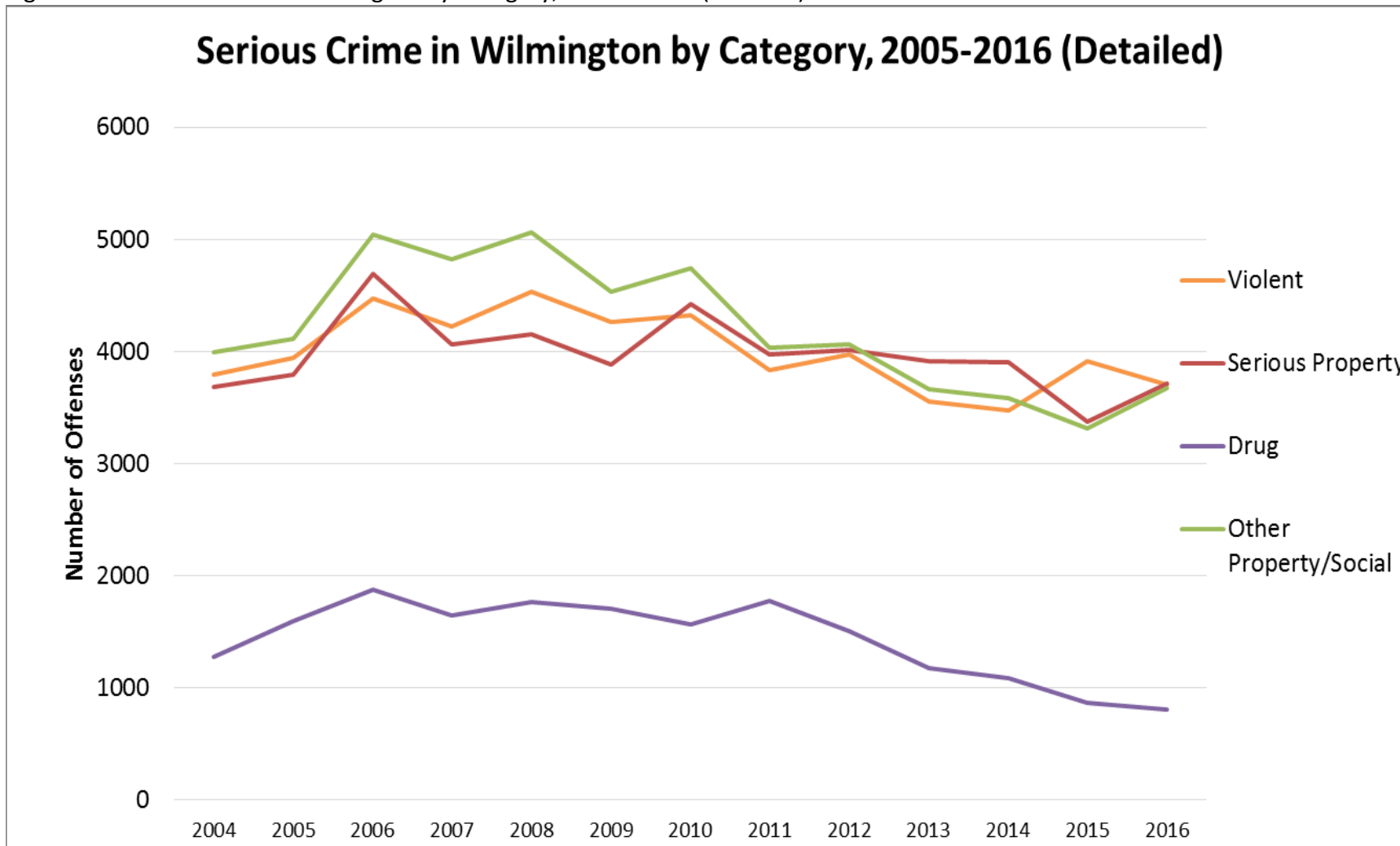

Figure 2: Most Common Serious Crimes in Wilmington, 2005 – 2016

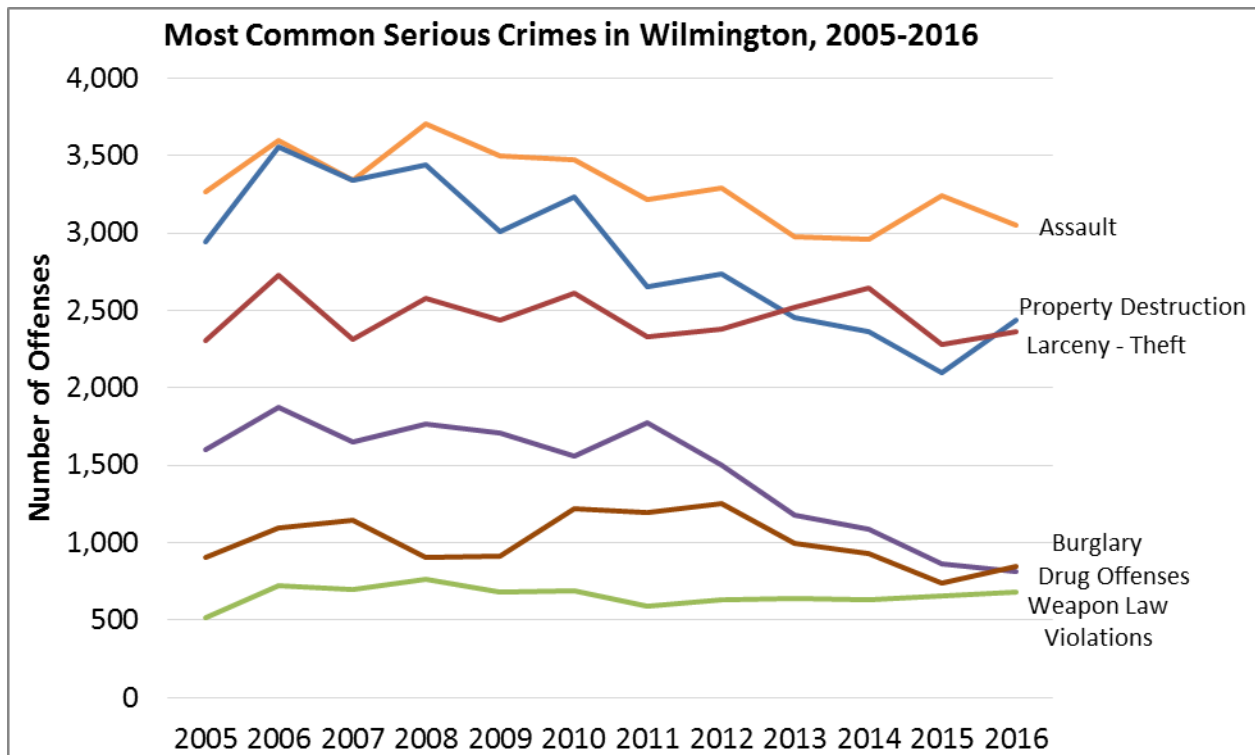
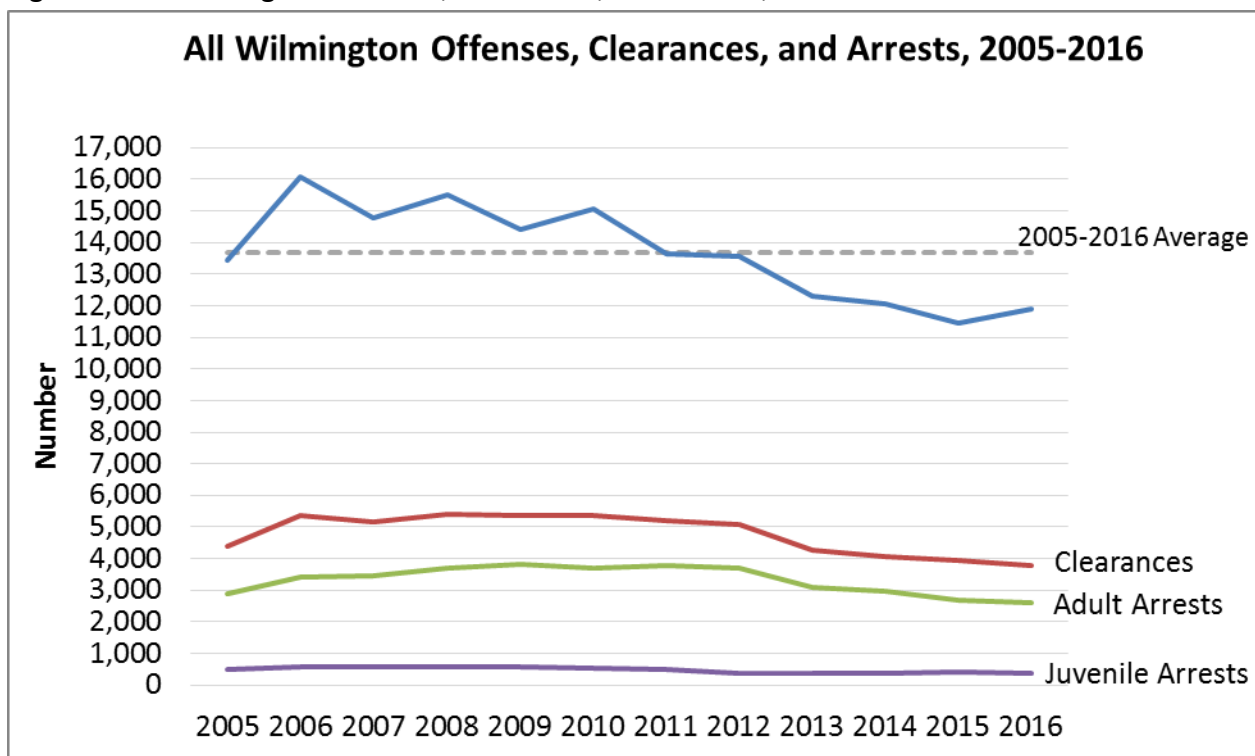


Figure 3: All Wilmington Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2005 – 2016



A Detailed Look at Crime in Wilmington

The following section provides more detailed information about serious crime in Wilmington. Included is a summary of notable findings for specific crimes within the four crime categories (Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Serious Property Offenses) along with tables that provide detailed counts of offenses, clearances, and adult and juvenile arrests.

Note to the reader:

In previous reports, “Final” data was distinguished from “Preliminary” data due to the fact that offense totals tended to fluctuate, sometimes substantially, for 12-15 months after the end of a given reporting year. Since these fluctuations would otherwise distort the magnitude of any changes in crime when comparing data still considered to be volatile compared to data considered to be stable, a decision was made to compare final data to final data and preliminary data (not yet considered stable) to preliminary data.

Violent Offenses

- The number of Criminal Homicides (28) is the highest for the five year report period.
- Forcible Sex Offenses (a lower frequency crime) was 38% higher in 2016 as compared to 2012, but down 12% from 2015. This is largely attributable to a sudden increase in Forcible Fondling charges and Rape by Force charges.
- Assault and Robbery offenses both decreased (7% and 10%) compared to 2012. Robbery has been increasing over the past 3 years.
- Assault offenses that involved the use of firearm were 49% higher in 2016 compared to 2012 and has shown a steady increase over the report period. Robbery with a Firearm offenses totals have been mixed. While not reported in the NIBRS data, most criminal homicides in 2016 involved the use of a firearm.

Serious Property Offenses

- Burglary offenses were 32% lower compared to 2012, but showed a recent 14% increase from 2015 to 2016.
- The number of all Larceny offenses was flat compared with 2012. Within that subcategory of crime:
 - The number of Theft from a Building offenses was 16% lower than 2012.
 - The number of Theft from a Motor Vehicle offenses was 29% higher than 2012.
- The number of Motor Vehicle Parts/Accessories Theft offenses was down about 50% compared to 2012.

Drug/Narcotic Offenses

- Overall, the number of offenses in this category in 2016 was 46% lower than 2012. Drug Equipment offenses were 70% lower during this period.
- Both totals reflected lows for the report period and are part of a long-term downward trend.

Other Property and Social Offenses

- The number of Fraud offenses was 29% lower in 2016 compared to 2012. This decrease was largely driven by a substantial decline in Impersonation offenses (67%).
- The number of Destruction, Damage, Vandalism of Property offenses showed an 11% decrease since 2012.
- Weapon Law Violations were 8% higher compared to 2012.
