Subject: Superior Court Detention Case Status of Long Term Detainees: 1st Quarter 2009,

March 31, 2009

This is an updated quarterly report that provides an overview of Superior Court detention population cases for defendants detained longer than 120 days in a Level V Delaware Department of Correction (DOC) secure facility or the Delaware Psychiatric Center. Although the detainees may have more than one case for which he/she is being held, only the case with the highest charge for which an individual is being held is reported. This report also gives the statewide and county breakdowns for the Superior Court detainee population in a secure DOC facility 121-days or more for the 1st quarter of 2009, and a historical look of these populations since the 3rd quarter of 2006.

There are numerous reasons why an offender with a Superior Court case may be detained in a secure facility for 120 days or more. Superior Court detainees with no specific case complications are found in the category of "active" detention cases. These "active" cases are following normal court processes and have not been sentenced as of the end of the quarter. The second group of detainee cases, "other non-sentenced detention cases," are those consisting of persons with cases involving psychological issues, and those defendants found guilty but awaiting sentencing. Murder 1st degree cases are also in this "other non-sentenced" category. These cases are not held to the same time processing standards as "active cases."

The statewide Superior Court detention population summary, found in Table 1, shows a population of 262 individuals that have been detained longer than 120 days. Of these 262 individuals, 145 cases are pending disposition without exceptional circumstances. Fifty-two are guilty but awaiting sentencing, 53 are Murder 1st cases, and the remaining 12 cases are waiting on some type of psychological evaluation. Three of the 12 individuals are being held at the Delaware Psychiatric Center.

From the second, third and fourth tables, we can see the detailed breakout by county. New Castle County has the largest percent of the statewide Superior Court detention population (69.1 percent). The remaining 30 percent of Superior Court cases are split between Kent County (17.6 percent) and Sussex County (13.4 percent).



The final table displays the Superior Court detention population by quarter since September 30, 2006. The total 1st quarter 2009 Superior Court detention population has decreased by 56 individuals, with a 39 person decrease in active cases, and a 17 person increase in the non-sentenced detention category. Fourth Quarter 2008 marks the highest population in all categories since this report's inception in 3rd Quarter 2006. First Quarter of 2009 marks the largest decrease in total Superior Court detainees of all quarters but is still slightly higher than the 1st Quarter of 2008.
