

Clearance	For crime reporting and analysis purposes, an offense is considered 'cleared' or solved when a suspect is either arrested and subsequently referred for prosecution or cannot be arrested but is otherwise clearly identifiable. This term is more fully explained in the body and the appendix of this report.				
Crime Incident	One or more crimes/offenses committed by the same offender, or group of offenders at the same time and place. A Crime Incident may involve more than one reported offense.				
Crime Rate	The number of crimes/offenses per 1,000 people. $\frac{offenses}{population}X$ 1,000				
Drug/Narcotic Offenses	The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Crime in Delaware is the official report of serious crime known to Delaware law enforcement agencies. This report provides information about 24 Violent, Serious Property, Drug/Narcotic and Other Property and Social Offenses reported in Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) operated by the State Bureau of Identification of the Delaware State Police. Data for the years 2018 through 2022 are included in this report. Also, as appropriate, data for the years 2011 through 2017 are added to illustrate long-term trends.

Key Findings/Trends

Overall, serious crime has decreased since 2018. The number of serious criminal offenses known to police in 2022 was 68,461 compared to 75,484 in 2018, a decrease of 9%.

Violent crime in the State decreased 8% from 2018 to 2022, continuing an overall long-term decline.

There were 71 statewide homicides in 2022—49 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 19 Vehicular Homicide, 3 other Negligent Manslaughter—down from 2021's record high of 107 (95 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 11 Vehicular Homicide, 1 other Negligent Manslaughter). While the overall number of Criminal Homicides increased by 48% from 2018 to 2022, most of that increase is attributable to the FBI's decision to add Vehicular Homicides to NIBRS as of 2019. When focusing just on Murder, Nonnegligent Manslaughter offenses, the increase for the same period is just 2%, while there was a 48% decrease from 2021 to 2022.

Serious Property Offenses decreased 12% between 2018 and 2022. Burglary Offenses decreased 35% from 2018 to 2022.

Drug Possession Offenses decreased 28% from 2018 to 2022. Drug Equipment Offenses decreased 8%.

Other Property and Social Offenses remained almost unchanged, decreasing less than one percent between 2018 and 2022. One of the most common offenses, Fraud, increased almost 10% over the same period.

Three of the most frequently reported crimes—Assault Offenses, Larceny/Theft, and Property Destruction/Vandalism continued long downward trends from 2018 to 2022. Assault Offenses decreased 5.7%, Larceny/Theft decreased 10.1% (despite an 8% increase over 2021), and Property Destruction/Vandalism decreased 11.7%.

Based on 2022 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to the rates from 2018 through 2021. In 2022, 50.1% of offenses were cleared by the end of the year.

Violent Assaults against Law Enforcement Officers decreased by 3% between 2018 and 2022.

INTRODUCTION

Crime in Delaware is the official report of serious crime reported to Delaware law enforcement agencies. This report covers data on serious crimes that were reported to Delaware's state, county, and local police agencies for the years 2018 through 2022.

The report is divided into the following sections:

- A summary of serious crime data at the state and county levels.
- A detailed data section with information about serious offenses, clearance rates, arrests, law enforcement agency staffing, and violent crimes committed against law enforcement officers.
- A Technical Appendix with a detailed discussion of clearance rates, along with a glossary of crime definitions and National Criminal Information Center (NCIC) crime codes.

Crime in Delaware provides data about the 24 Group A Offenses reported in Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). These offenses include Drug/Narcotic Offenses and 23 other specific crimes/crime categories listed below:

¹ In 2019, the FBI began including Vehicular Homicides under the Criminally Negligent Manslaughter category. Starting with this report, the SAC is reporting offenses for this crime separately from other Negligent Manslaughter offenses to allow for better insights regarding Criminal Homicide.

METHODOLOGY

Data Sources

Data for this report were drawn from two sources:

- The State Bureau of Identification (SBI) of the Delaware State Police, which maintains
 Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (for
 simplicity, is referred to as 'NIBRS' in the data section of this report), where offense,
 clearance, arrest, and crimes against law enforcement officers are derived. SBI is also
 the source of law enforcement agency staffing numbers.
- The Delaware Population Consortium, from which state and county population figures are drawn.

Delaware NIBRS data files for 2022 were downloaded from the Delaware Department of Technology and Information secure document library on March 31, 2023.

Preparing the Data for Inclusion in *Crime in Delaware*

Checking Data Quality

Single-year NIBRS data files and reports prepared by SBI are not in a production-ready/user-friendly format, nor do they contain the various statistics (differences, crime rates, percentages) that Crime in Delaware includes. Historically, the SAC downloaded summary data reports as text files, imported them to Microsoft Excel, then cleaned and transformed them so that the summary data could be collated across years and examined at the state and county levels using appropriate computations and calculations.

However, beginning with this report, the SAC has instituted a new, faster, and more efficient process. Instead of summary reports, the SAC downloaded the offense-level data files that SBI uses to create the summary reports. Using *R: A Language and Environment for Statistical Computing*,² the process of checking and preparing data and computing summary statistics was automated, as was a substantial portion of the process of generating report tables.

The adoption of *R* provided substantial savings in staff time and effort, along with increased accuracy in the process of moving from downloaded data files to final tables and figures.

Statistical Refinements

Adoption of R: While not a statistical refinement per se, the adoption of R (mentioned above) allows for increased accuracy in proceeding from downloaded data files to finished data tables and figures by removing much of the manual effort that process previously required. As R is further incorporated into the Center's work, we anticipate making additional statistical refinements.

Notes and Important Considerations

Data in this report reflect only the serious crimes known to police (i.e., have been reported to the police or that police have observed). Some serious crime incidents are never reported or detected. Other serious crime incidents may only be reported or detected months or years after they occurred. The numbers in this report should, therefore, be considered as a floor estimate—that is, there was at least as much serious crime as noted in this report, likely more. Less serious offenses, for which NIBRS only contains arrest data, are not included in this report.

Caution should be used in drawing conclusions about changes in the occurrence of serious crime based on the data in this report. The following considerations should be kept in mind:

- Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent State of Emergency declarations, court closings, and travel restrictions within the State of Delaware, it is not possible to discern if, or how much, those events impacted year-to-year changes in offense totals. Therefore, caution should be used when comparing offense trends involving 2020/2021 data.
- NIBRS data in this report reflect the number of offenses/charges rather than unique criminal incidents. A single criminal incident can result in a single charge filed by police or multiple charges depending on what criminal behaviors occur during the incident and the characteristics of the incident itself (e.g., the number of victims and alleged offenders).
- Crime Rate figures (i.e., the number of crimes per 1,000 people) are best viewed in the context of other crime and population data. The Crime Rate reflects not just the change in the number of offenses known to law enforcement officers but the change in the population as well. Even if the number of offenses has not changed from one year to the next, changes in population will make it appear that crime has decreased (in the event of a population increase) or that it has increased (if the population decreases). The Crime Rate, when used by itself, can create a distorted picture of crime.
- Use caution in comparing jurisdictions, counties, and states. Differences in community socioeconomic factors, population trends, and how law enforcement agencies operate (in charging practices when an arrest is made; in interpreting crime definitions; in enforcement priorities, etc.) can vary greatly among communities, all of which create challenges in making accurate and valid comparisons. Also, participation in NIBRS is

voluntary and not all states choose to participate; even among many states that participate, not all jurisdictions elect to take part. Where crime data for a state are not complete, the FBI must create estimates to account for those data gaps.

The FBI says it best in the introductory note to its *Preliminary Annual Uniform Crime Report, January-December, 2012*³:

"Individuals ... are cautioned against drawing conclusions by making direct comparisons between cities. Comparisons lead to simplistic and/or incomplete analyses that often create misleading perceptions adversely affecting communities and their residents. Valid assessments are possible only with careful study and analysis of the range of unique conditions affecting each local law enforcement jurisdiction. ... remember that crime is a social problem and, therefore, a concern of the entire community. The efforts of law enforcement are limited to factors within its control. The data user is, therefore, cautioned against comparing statistical data of individual agencies."

- Arrest data for Negligent Manslaughter: Vehicular Homicide offenses for 2019 through 2022, and Human Trafficking arrest data for 2022 were not available in the downloaded arrest data files. The Center could not arrive at satisfactory arrest counts for these two crimes through alternative means; as a result no arrest data are included for those crimes in this report.
- Use caution when interpreting data for the Fraud crimes of Identity Theft and
 Hacking/Computer Invasion. Issues with the way these crimes were coded in the
 downloaded data accounts for the drastic swing in the counts for these crimes. The SAC
 does not yet have a means for correcting these counts.

A Note About Clearances/Clearance Rates

The federal definition of *clearance rate* is the percentage of offenses received that are 'solved' through an arrest or by exceptional means. An offense is 'cleared by arrest' for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to a court for prosecution.

In certain situations, an offender is known but is not or cannot be arrested and formally charged. When this happens, the offense can be cleared by *exceptional means*. Such situations include, but are not limited to, offender death or confession; an offender who cannot be extradited from another jurisdiction; refusal of a victim to cooperate in a prosecution; handling a juvenile offender through an alternative police policy.

It is important to keep in mind that the arrest or identification of one offender may clear multiple offenses. Alternatively, multiple arrests may clear only a single offense.

SERIOUS CRIME AT-A-GLANCE

This section of the report provides summary-level data about serious crime in Delaware and in the state's three counties for the years 2018 to 2022. Included in this section are data about the total number of serious offenses and the four major categories of crime: Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug Offenses, and Other Property and Social Offenses.

The specific topics addressed in this section are as follows:

- offenses received by law enforcement agencies
- offense clearances
- crime rates
- differences in the number of offenses received between years
- total arrests and arrests of adults and juveniles; and
- assaults against law enforcement officers.

All state-level summary data, organized by the topics above, are presented first. All summary data, again organized by topic, are then presented for each county. More detailed data about offenses and clearances, arrests, and assaults against law enforcement officers can be found in the '…Detailed Look at Serious Crime…' section beginning on page 31.

Note to the reader

As noted earlier in this report, please use caution when comparing Delaware's data to national data or those for other states. Crime data, particularly crime rates, are best understood in the context of other data.

Delaware Serious Crime at-a-Glance, 2018 – 2022




Figure 2: Final Differences in Serious Criminal Offenses, by State and County, 2018 and 2022

Overall, there were 7,023 fewer reported serious Group A Offenses in 2022 compared to 2018 (9.3%) (see Table 1 and Figure 1). Three out of the four crime categories were substantially lower compared to 2018 with the greatest declines in Drug Offenses (22.8%) and Serious Property Offenses (11.7%). Violent Offenses decreased 7.5% over the same period, while the number of Other Property and Social Offenses changed very little (-0.7%). Long-term trends in offenses since 2011 are also presented in Figure 1. Crime category differences from 2018 to 2022 for Delaware are presented in Figure 2.

Other Property and Social Offenses were the most frequently reported category of crimes in 2022 (31.1%), followed by Serious Property Offenses (30.2%), Violent Offenses (25.2%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (13.5%). Although the proportions fluctuated slightly, the order from least to most common category remained the same.

The most frequently reported offenses were Larceny/Theft; Assault; Property Destruction/Vandalism; and Drug/Narcotic. All categories declined from 2018 to 2022, with Drug Offenses experiencing the most dramatic decline (22.8%). Property Destruction/Vandalism, Larceny/Theft, and Assault decreased 11.7%, 10.1%, and 5.7%, respectively.

Based on 2022 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to the rates from 2018 through 2022 (see Table 1 and Figure 4). Offenses in the Drug/Narcotic and Violent Offense categories continue to be cleared at high rates (95.6% and 75.2%, respectively). Overall, just over half of the offenses committed in 2022 were cleared by the end of the calendar year (50.1%). Trends since 2011 can be seen in Figure 4.

The number of arrests from 2018 to 2022 was lower for all categories. Arrests for the Serious Property, Other Property and Social Offenses, and Violent Offenses categories were 31.8%, 8.6%, and 10.7% lower, respectively. Drug Offense arrests decreased less than one percent (-0.9%).

In 2022, 414 assault-related offenses were committed against law enforcement officers, about 3% lower when compared to 2018, with no officers killed. Nearly all violent offenses against law enforcement officers were cleared by the end of the calendar year (94.9%). Figure 5 illustrates the long-term trends in assaults against Delaware law enforcement officers.






Figure 3: Most Common Serious Crimes in Delaware, 2011 – 2022

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


New Castle County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2018 – 2022

Overall, there were 5,225 fewer reported serious Group A Offenses in the county in 2022 compared to 2018, a decline of 12.4% (see Table 4 and Figure 6). Three of the four categories decreased substantially. The greatest declines were for Drug Offenses (35.3%) and Violent Offenses (15.1%). The number of Other Property, Social Offenses was essentially unchanged (-0.8%), though did decrease 11.7% compared to 2021. Long-term trends in offenses since 2011 are presented in Figure 6.

Serious Property Offenses (34.1%) and Other Property, Social Offenses (33.4%) were the two most frequently reported crime categories in the county in 2022, followed by Violent Offenses (22.9%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (9.7%).

The most frequently reported offenses in the county in 2022 were Larceny/Theft; Assault; Property Destruction/Vandalism; Fraud; Drug/Narcotic, and Weapon and Law Violations. Four of these offenses saw decreases of varying degrees compared to 2018. Larceny/Theft, Property Destruction/Vandalism, Assault, and Drug Offenses continued downward trends with overall decreases between 10.4% and 35.3%, while Fraud and Weapons Law Violations increased by 15.4% and 18.3%, respectively. Figure 7 displays the long-term trends in these offenses since 2011.




Figure 8: All New Castle County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Based on 2022 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to previous years (see Table 4 and Figure 8). Offenses in the Drug and Violent categories continue to be cleared at high rates (92.3% and 69.6%, respectively). Overall, 41.3% of all offenses committed in 2022 were cleared by the end of the year. Trends since 2011 can be seen in Figure 8.

Total arrests in the county were 15.8% lower compared to 2018 (see Table 5 and Figure 8). Juvenile arrests showed an overall decrease of 29.3%. The number of adult arrests decreased 14.1%. Trends in arrests since 2011 can also be seen in Figure 8.

The number of law enforcement officers assaulted in 2022 was 210 (a 5% decrease), the lowest figure in the reporting period. No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2022, and there were no attempted homicides of officers. Assault-related offenses continued to be cleared at very high rates (96.2%). Long-term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime At-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).





Figure 6: Serious Crime in New Castle County by Category, 2011 – 2022

Kent County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2018 – 2022

Overall, there were 45 fewer reported serious Group A Offenses in Kent County in 2022 compared to 2018, a decline of just 0.3% (see Table 7 and Figure 9). Two out of the four crime categories decreased compared to 2018, with Serious Property Offenses down by 3.5% and Drug Offenses down by 10.9%. Other Property Social Offenses increased by 4.9%, Violent Offenses, 5.7%.

Other Property and Social Offenses was the most frequently reported category of crime in Kent County in 2022 (27.6%), followed by Violent Offenses (27.8%), Serious Property Offenses (28%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (16.8%).

The most frequently reported offenses for the county in 2022 were Assault; Larceny/Theft; Property Destruction/Vandalism; Fraud, Burglary; and Drug/Narcotic. Larceny/Theft, Property Destruction/Vandalism, Burglary, and Drug Offenses showed declines from 2018 to 2022 ranging from 5% to 29%, while Fraud and Assault increased 7% and 8%, respectively. Figure 10 portrays the long-term trends of offenses since 2011.




Figure 11: All Kent County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Based on 2022 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to those from 2018 through 2021 (see Table 7 and Figure 11). Offenses in the Drug and Violent categories continue to be cleared at high rates (97.5% and 78.5%, respectively). Overall, 59.2% of all offenses committed in 2022 had been cleared by the end of the calendar year. Trends since 2011 can be seen in Figure 11.

The total number of arrests in the county decreased by 7.5% from 2018 through 2022, continuing a long downward trend (see Table 8 and Figure 11). Both Juvenile and adult arrests declined, 26.2% and 5.2%, respectively. Trends in arrests since 2011 are shown in Figure 11.

The 2022 data indicate that there was a 14.7% decrease in assaults against law enforcement officers compared to 2018 (see Table 9). No officers were killed in the line of duty during 88 assaults in 2022, and there was one attempted homicide of a law enforcement officer. Most assaults against law enforcement officers in Kent County were cleared by the end of the calendar year (89.8%). Long-term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime At-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).





Figure 9: Serious Crime in Kent County by Category, 2011 – 2022

Sussex County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2018 – 2022

Overall, there were 1,753 fewer reported serious Group A Offenses in Sussex County in 2022 compared to 2018, a decrease of 9.7% (see Table 10 and Figure 12). All four of the crime categories—Violent Offenses, Serious Offenses, Drug Offenses, and Other Property and Social Offenses—decreased compared to 2018 (2.9%, 19%, 13.1%, and 4.9%, respectively). Long-term trends in offenses since 2011 are also presented in Figure 12.

Other Property & Social Offenses is the most frequent reported category in 2022 (29.2%). Violent Offenses made up 28.2%, Serious Property Offenses accounted for 23.5%, and Drug/Narcotic Offenses comprised 19%.

The most frequently reported offenses in the county in 2022 were Assault; Larceny/Theft; Property Destruction/Vandalism; Fraud, Burglary; and Drug/Narcotic. Four of the six most frequent offenses had overall declines from 2018 to 2022 ranging from 10% to 44.2%, while Assault (-0.8%) and Fraud (0.7%) were essentially unchanged. Figure 13 also portrays the long-term trends in these offenses since 2011.

Based on 2022 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to the rates from 2018 through 2021 (see Table 10 and Figure 14). Drug and Violent Offenses continue to be cleared at high rates (97.9% and 82.3%, respectively). Overall, 61.5% of all offenses committed in 2022 had been cleared by year's end. Trends since 2011 can be seen in Figure 14.

The number of Total Adult arrests decreased 13.8%, while juvenile arrests decreased 20.1% from 2018-2022

The 2022 data shows a gradual increase in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county (see Table 12). There were 116 assaults against officers in 2022. No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2022, and there were no attempted homicides on officers. Almost all of assaults against law enforcement officers were cleared by the end of the calendar year (96.6%). Long-term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime at-a-Glance section located earlier in this report)





A DETAILED LOOK AT SERIOUS CRIME IN DELAWARE

The following sections provide more detailed information about serious crime in Delaware. Each section has a single topic focus: one of the four crime categories and violent crimes against law enforcement officers. Within each crime category section, statewide data on offenses, clearances, and arrests are presented first, followed by the same data for each county. The section on crimes against law enforcement officers presents the state and county data relevant to this topic.

Note to the reader

As noted earlier in this report, please use caution when comparing Delaware's data to national data or those for other states. Crime data, particularly crime rates, are best understood in the context of other data.

Delaware Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses were 7.5% lower in 2022 when compared with 2018. The two most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Assault and Robbery—experienced declines of 5.7% and 33.4%, respectively. Of special note:

There were 71 statewide homicides in 2022—49 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 19 Vehicular Homicide, 3 other Negligent Manslaughter—down from 2021's record high of 107 (95 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 11 Vehicular Homicide, 1 other Negligent Manslaughter). While the overall number of Criminal Homicides increased by 48% from 2018 to 2022, most of that increase is attributable to the FBI's decision to add Vehicular Homicides to NIBRS as of 2019. When focusing just on Murder, Nonnegligent Manslaughter offenses, the increase for the same period is just 2%, while there was a 48% decrease from 2021 to 2022.

Assaults with a Firearm increased 30.9% over the report period, while Robberies with a Firearm decreased 38.8%.

Most Kidnapping and Assault offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022 (85.5% and 77.4%, respectively). Forty-three percent of Robbery offenses, 62% of Criminal Homicide offenses, and 48.5% of Forcible Sex offenses were cleared during that period. Total Violent Offenses in 2022 were cleared at rates comparable to those for the previous four years. Criminal Homicides were cleared at a higher rate in 2022 (62%) than in 2021 (44.9%).




Figure 15: Delaware Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Tables 13–19 and Figure 15 provide information about Statewide Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 15.

New Castle County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the County were 15.1% lower in 2022 when compared with 2018. The two most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Assault and Robbery—experienced declines of 13.7% and 34.2%, respectively. Assault continues a downward trend.

Of special note:

- There were 37 homicides in 2022—27 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 8 Vehicular Homicide, 2 other Negligent Manslaughter—down from 2021's record high of 76 (71 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 4 Vehicular Homicide, and 1 other Negligent Manslaughter). While the overall number of Criminal Homicides increased by 2.8% from 2018 to 2022, most of that increase is attributable to the FBI's decision to add Vehicular Homicides to NIBRS as of 2019. When focusing just on Murder, Nonnegligent Manslaughter offenses, there is a decrease for the same period of 25%, as well as a decrease of 62% from 2021 to 2022.
- While Assault with a Firearm offenses rose 25.6% since 2018, overshadowing multiple other Aggravated Assault declines, the number of offenses decreased 22.7% from 2021-2022.
 Robbery with a Firearm Offenses were 38.7% lower since 2018.
- Most Kidnapping and Assault Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022 (90.4% and 72.1%, respectively). Less than half of all Forcible Sex Offenses were cleared (45.5%).
- More than half (59.5%) of Homicide Offenses and 42.3% of Robbery Offenses were cleared during that period. Overall, Violent Offenses in 2022 were cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.




Figure 16: New Castle County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Tables 20 – 26 and Figure 16 provide detailed information about New Castle County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 16.

Kent County Violent Offenses and Clearances.

Overall, Violent Offenses in the county increased 6% in 2022 when compared with 2018. Out of the three most common crimes, Robbery decreased 45% from 2018, while Assaults increased 8% and Forcible Sex Offenses decreased 6%. Of special note:

Robbery with a Firearm Offenses decreased 60% since 2018. Assault with a Firearm Offenses have increased 6% since 2021.

There were 18 county homicides in 2022—13 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 5 Vehicular Homicide, zero other Negligent Manslaughter—down slightly from 2021's record high of 19 (16 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 3 Vehicular Homicide, and zero other Negligent Manslaughter). While the overall number of Criminal Homicides increased by 200% from 2018 to 2022, almost half of that increase is attributable to the FBI's decision to add Vehicular Homicides to NIBRS as of 2019. When focusing just on Murder, Nonnegligent Manslaughter offenses, the increase for the same period is much lower (116.7%), while there was a 19% decrease from 2021 to 2022.




Figure 17: Kent County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Tables 27–33 and Figure 17 provide detailed information about Kent County Violent Offenses, Clearances, Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 17.

Sussex County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the county were 2.9% lower in 2022 compared with 2018. Two of the three most commonly reported offenses decreased. Robbery Offenses decreased 14.9% and Forcible Sex Offenses decreased 39.8%, while Assaults essentially remained unchanged (- 0.9%). Of special note:

- There were 16 homicides in 2022 which was a record high—9 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 6 Vehicular Homicide, and 1 other Negligent Manslaughter—up from 2021's number of 12 (8 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 4 Vehicular Homicide). While the overall number of Criminal Homicides increased by 167% from 2018 to 2022, most of that increase is attributable to the FBI's decision to add Vehicular Homicides to NIBRS as of 2019. When focusing just on Murder, Nonnegligent Manslaughter offenses, the increase for the same period is just 2.5%, while there was 14% decrease from 2021 to 2022.
- Robbery with a Firearm Offenses are down 5.7% from 2018.
- Three of the four categories of Aggravated Assault Offenses increased. Aggravated Assaults, overall, showed a 26.3% increase from 2018. Aggravated Assault with a Firearm increased 70% over the same period but decreased 6.8% from 2021-2022. Other Dangerous Weapons and Hands/Fists/Feet Aggravated Assault categories increased 7.7% and 57.8%, respectively.

Most offenses (82.3%) had been cleared by the end of 2022. Most categories of Violent Offenses committed in 2022 were cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.




Figure 18: Sussex County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Tables 34–40 and Figure 18 provide detailed information about Sussex County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends from 2011 are shown in Figure 18.

Delaware Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses were 11.7% lower in 2022 when compared with 2018, continuing an overall downward trend. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Burglary, Larceny/Theft, and Motor Vehicle Theft—had mixed trends compared to 2018. Burglary and Larceny/Theft Offenses experienced decreases of 34.5% and 10.1%, respectively, compared with 2018. The number of Motor Vehicle Theft Offenses increased 15.3%. Of special note:

- Burglary offenses decreased across all three subcategories since 2018.
- The three most common Larceny/Theft offenses—Shoplifting, Theft from a Building, and Theft from a Motor Vehicle—all experienced decreases from 2018 to 2022 (7.5%, 16.7%, and 35.2%, respectively). However, the fourth most common category—Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts and/or Accessories—experienced a 133.1% increase.
- After a small decrease (1.5%) from 2020-2021, Motor Vehicle Theft offenses resumed their recent pattern of year-over-year increases (3.1% from 2021 to 2022).

For all Serious Property Offense crimes, 24.6% of offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022. However, offenses for almost all crimes in this category were generally cleared at rates comparable to those for the previous four years.




Figure 19: Delaware Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Tables 41 – 47 and Figure 19 provide detailed information about Statewide Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 19.

New Castle County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were almost 12% lower in 2022 when compared with 2018. Two out of the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Larceny and Burglary—decreased significantly, 10.4% and 30.8%, respectively. The number of Motor Vehicle Theft Offenses was essentially unchanged (a 0.3% increase). Of special note:

- The three most common Larceny Offenses—Shoplifting, Theft from a Motor Vehicle, and Theft from a Building—all decreased compared to 2018 (8.7%, 38.4%, and 17.2%, respectively).
- Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts, Accessories had a significant increase of 151.4% in 2022 when compared with 2018.

Overall, just under 19% of Serious Property Offense crimes had been cleared by the end of 2022. Crimes within this category were generally cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.




Figure 20: New Castle County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Tables 48 – 54 and Figure 20 provide detailed information about New Castle County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 20.

Kent County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were 3.5% lower in 2022 when compared with 2018. Two of the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses— Larceny/Theft and Burglary—decreased. The number of Larceny/Theft Offenses decreased 4.9% from 2018 to 2022, with Burglary decreasing by 28.6%. Motor Vehicle Theft, the other most common offense, increased 71.8% from 2018 to 2022 and 48.8% from 2021 to 2022. Of special note:

- Theft from a Motor Vehicle decreased 27% from 2018 to 2022 with a 4% increase from 2021 to 2022.
- Shoplifting Offenses have increased just 5% since 2018 with a 40% increase in the shortterm from 2021 to 2022 after a few years of decreases.
- Theft from a Building Offenses decreased notably since 2018 (16%).

For all Serious Property Offense crimes, 31.8% of offenses were cleared by the end of 2022. Most offenses within this category were cleared at rates roughly comparable to those for the previous four years.

Tables 55 – 61 and Figure 21 provide detailed information about Kent County Serious Property Offenses, clearances, and juvenile and adult arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 21.



Sussex County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were 19% lower in 2022 when compared with 2018. Two of the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses-Larceny/Theft and Burglary—exhibited decreases. Larceny/Theft decreased 14.8% and Burglary declined 44.2% from 2018 to 2022. Motor Vehicle Theft Offenses increased 38.1 % from 2018 to 2022. Of special note:

- Theft from a Building decreased 16% since 2018.
- Shoplifting had an overall decrease of 20.4% from 2018 to 2022.
- Theft From a Motor Vehicle decreased 25%, while Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts increased 55.1% from 2018 to 2022.

Overall, just under 36% of Serious Property Offense crimes had been cleared by the end of 2022. However, offenses for almost all crimes in this category were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.




Figure 22: Sussex County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Figure 23: Delaware Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022



Figure 24: New Castle County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022



Figure 25: Kent County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022



Figure 26: Sussex County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022



Delaware Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, the number of Other Property and Social Offenses was essentially unchanged in 2022 when compared with 2018 (a decrease of just 0.7%). However, from 2021 to 2022, the number decreased 10.2% after a substantial jump the previous year. The differences in offense totals from 2018 to 2022 for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapon Law Violations—were mixed. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism Offenses decreased 11.7% during that period. The number of Fraud offenses and Weapon Law Violations increased 9.6% and 22.7%, respectively.

Overall, 34.8% of all Other Property and Social offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022. Many of the crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates near or above 50%. However, two crimes among those with the lowest clearance rates—Fraud and Property Destruction/Vandalism accounted for 75.8% of the offenses in this category, contributing to the low overall clearance rate. Almost all crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates comparable to, or better than, those for the previous four years.




Figure 27: Delaware Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Tables 89 – 97 and Figure 27 provide detailed information about Statewide Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 27.

A Note About Identity Theft and Hacking/Computer Invasion Counts

Issues with the way these crimes were coded in the downloaded data accounts for the drastic swing in the counts for these crimes. The SAC does not yet have a means for correcting these counts. Overall Fraud offense totals are correct, however.

New Castle County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, the number of Other Property and Social Offenses in the county was essentially unchanged (0.8%) in 2022 compared to 2018 but decreased 11.7% when compared to 2021. The patterns of differences for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category—Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapons Law Violations—were mixed. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism decreased 14.2%, while Weapons Violations increased 18.3%. Fraud Offenses increased 15.4% in 2022 compared to 2018 but decreased 27.7% when compared to 2021.

Some other categories of note:

• Counterfeiting/Forgery Offenses reported the highest figure over the 5-year period, with a 21.5% increase from 2018-2022 and a 59.9% increase from 2021 to 2022.

Overall, 30.3% of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022. Two crimes with some of the lowest clearance rates, Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism and Fraud account for over 75% of the offenses in this category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Most other crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at much higher rates, a pattern comparable to the past four years.




Figure 28: NCC Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022

Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Other Property and Social Offenses in the county were 5% higher in 2022, when compared with 2018. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category—Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapon Law Violations— were mixed from 2018 to 2022. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism decreased 5%, while Fraud and Weapon Law Violations increased 7% and 35, respectively.

Overall, 44.1% of all Other Property and Social offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022. Many crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, two crimes with some of the lowest clearance rates, Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism and Fraud, accounted for 71% of the offenses in this category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Almost all crimes in this category of offenses were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.




Figure 29: Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 22

Tables 107 – 115 and Figure 29 provide detailed information about Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 29.

Sussex County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, the number of Other Property and Social offenses in the county was 4.9% lower in 2022 when compared with 2018. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism, Fraud, and Weapon Law Violations showed mix patterns. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism decreased 10%, while Fraud remained unchanged (0.7%), and Weapon Law Violations increased 24.2% since 2018.

Overall, 38.2% of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022. Many crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, the crimes with some of the lowest clearance rates – Fraud and Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism – account for 79% of the crimes in this offense category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Most offenses in this category were cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.




Figure 30: Sussex Cnty. Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 22

Tables 116 – 124 and Figure 30 provide detailed information about Sussex County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2011 are also presented in Figure 30.

LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY STAFFING AND OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED, 2018 – 2022

This final section of the *Crime in Delaware* report examines the staffing trends among Delaware's police agencies and violent crimes committed against law enforcement officers.

Full Time Law Enforcement Officers and Civilian Employees

The number of law enforcement officers and civilians employed in Delaware police departments and agencies totaled 2,301 and 1,097, respectively, in 2022. The law enforcement officer total reflects a decrease of less than 1% between 2018 and 2022. The civilian employee total reflects an increase of 10.5% from 2018 to 2022.

In 2022, municipalities employed over half of Delaware's officers and 24% of the civilian law enforcement employees. The Delaware State Police employed 31% of officers, and 20% of the civilian law enforcement employees. Special Agencies such as Capitol Police, Delaware River and Bay Authority, the State Fire Marshal along with the Attorney General's Office employed the remaining 16% of officers, and 56% of civilian law enforcement employees (see Table 125). Table 142 contains a full list of employee counts by jurisdiction and employee type.

Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in Delaware

Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers were down 2.6% from 2018. Assault-related offenses committed against police officers in 2022 (414) were second lowest in the five-year period.

Almost all offenses, 94.9%, had been cleared before the end of 2022. Assaults continue to be cleared at rates around 95%. Figure 31 shows the trends in assaults against officers since 2011.

No officers were killed in 2022, but 24.2% of assaults resulted in injuries. There was a single attempted homicide of police officers in 2022, tied for the second lowest total in the five-year period.

Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, handling prisoners, and traffic pursuits, and most often involved single-officer vehicles. Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners accounted for roughly 60-70% of assaults against officers during the 2018 through 2022 period. Traffic stops and pursuits were associated with an additional 8-10% of assaults during that period.

Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers. From 2018 to 2022, 70-80% of all assaults involved the use of hands/fists/feet as a weapon.

Figure 31: Assaults Against Law Enforcement Officers, 2011 – 2022





Figure 32: Weapons Used Against Law Enforcement Officers 2018 – 2022







Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in New Castle County

Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers in the county have decreased from 2018 totals. Assault-related offenses committed against officers in the county were 5.4% lower in 2022 when compared to 2018, but year-to-year trends have been mixed. Trends in assaults against officers in the county since 2011 can be seen in Figure 31.

Almost all assault-related offenses (96.2%) had been cleared before the end of 2022. Assaults against officers in the county continue to be cleared at very high rates.

No officers were killed in 2022 in New Castle County and 21.9% of assaults on officers resulted in injuries. There were zero attempted homicides on officers in 2022. (Note: five of the attempted homicides in 2020 resulted from a single manhunt.)

Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners, and most often involved single-officer vehicles. Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners accounted for 65% of assaults against officers in the county during the 2018 through 2022 period.

Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers in the county and decreased from a high in 2018. From 2018 through 2022, on average 73.2% of all assaults against officers in the county involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as a weapon, with a high of 81.5% in 2018. On average, just over 5% of assaults were committed using a firearm or cutting instrument from 2018 to 2022.

Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in Kent County

Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers decreased from a 5 year high in 2018. Assault-related offenses committed against officers was 15% lower in 2022 when compared to 2018. Trends in assaults against officers in the county since 2011 can be seen in Figure 31.

Almost all assault related offenses had been cleared by the end of 2022. Assaults against officers in the county continue to be cleared at rates of 90% or higher.

No officers in the county were killed in 2022 but 25% of assault-related offenses resulted in injuries. No officers in the county were killed in the line of duty during the reporting period. There was one attempted homicide offense in 2022. The percentage of assault-related offenses that resulted in injury has fluctuated from year to year.

Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners, and most often involved single-officer vehicles. Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners accounted for 41-68% of assaults against officers in the county during the 2018 through 2022 period.

Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers in the county. During the period 2018 through 2022, an average of 73% of assaults against officers were involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as weapons. Assaults during this period that involved the use of a firearm, or a cutting instrument accounted for an average of just under 3.5% of the total offenses.

Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in Sussex County

Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers in the county in 2022 were the highest of the 5-year report period. This was a 16% increase from 2018 (a report period low) to 2022. Trends in assaults against officers in the county since 2011 can be seen in Figure 31.

The majority of assault-related offenses (96.6%) had been cleared before the end of 2022. Assaults against officers in the county continue to be cleared at rates averaging 96%.

No officers were killed in 2022 and with 27.6% of Assault offenses resulting in officer injuries. There were no attempted homicides of an officer in 2022.

Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners, and most often involved single-officer vehicles. Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners generally accounted for 60-70% of assaults against officers in the county during the 2018 through 2022 period.

Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers in the county. During the period 2018 through 2022, an average of 79.6% of assaults against officers involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as a weapon. Assaults during this period that involved the use of a firearm, or cutting instrument were very infrequent, averaging just over 4% from 2018 to 2022.

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TECHNICAL APPENDIX

Detailed Explanation of Clearance Rates

In crime analysis, criminal offenses are considered to be 'solved' through either an arrest or through an alternative means when a suspect(s) has been identified but an arrest cannot be made. When an offense is solved in this way, it is considered to have been 'cleared' for crime reporting purposes. The federal definition of *clearance rate* is the percentage of offenses received that are 'solved' through an arrest or by exceptional means. An offense is 'cleared by arrest' for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to a court for prosecution.

In certain situations, an offender cannot be arrested and formally charged. When this happens, the offense can be cleared by *exceptional means*. This type of clearance can be made if the following four conditions are met:

- the offender can be identified.
- there is enough evidence to support an arrest, make a charge, and turn the offender over to a court for prosecution.
- the offender's exact location is known so that the suspect could be taken into custody immediately.
- there are circumstances outside the control of law enforcement that prohibits the agency from arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.

Examples of exceptional clearances include, but are not limited to:

- the death of the offender
- confession of the offender under circumstances where prosecution is not possible (e.g., a death bed confession, a confession made while serving a life sentence in another jurisdiction and extradition for trial is not possible)
- the refusal of a victim to cooperate with the prosecution after the offender has been identified.
- denial of extradition (e.g., because the offender committed a crime in another jurisdiction and is being prosecuted for that offense)
- The handling of minor juvenile offenses outside of juvenile court as a matter of publicly accepted police policy.

Clearances involving only persons under 18 years of age

When a juvenile offender is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities, the FBI considers the incident in question to be cleared by arrest, even though a physical arrest may not have occurred. When clearances involve juvenile and adult offenders, those incidents are classified by the FBI as clearances for crimes committed by adults. Since clearance percentages for crimes involving juvenile offenders only include clearances where an adult was not also involved, juvenile clearance figures should be interpreted with caution—they do not present a definitive picture of juvenile involvement in crime.

Some Factors that Affect Clearance Rates

Single versus Multiple Offenses: In some situations, an offender may commit multiple criminal offenses, either in a single incident of crime or over several incidents. In other situations, two or more people may commit a single offense during a single criminal incident. These situations each work differently with respect to clearances. In the first example, the arrest or identification of that person can clear multiple offenses, while in the second example, the arrest or identification of several persons would only clear one offense.

The Nature of Some Types of Crime: Violent Criminal Offenses (Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault) often undergo a more intensive investigative effort than crimes against property. Also, victims and/or witnesses often identify the perpetrators. Property crimes such as theft from a motor vehicle or vandalism often occur in the absence of witnesses, making it more difficult to identify suspects. Consequently, Violent Offenses tend to have higher clearance rates than Property Offenses. Drug/Narcotic offenses clear at high rates because of the nature of those crimes and how they come to the attention of law enforcement agencies.

Robbery	Feloniously taking or attempting to take anything of value from someone by force, threat of force, violence, and/or by putting the victim in fear.
Sex Offenses, Forcible	Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
Forcible Rape	The carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity (or because of his/her youth).
