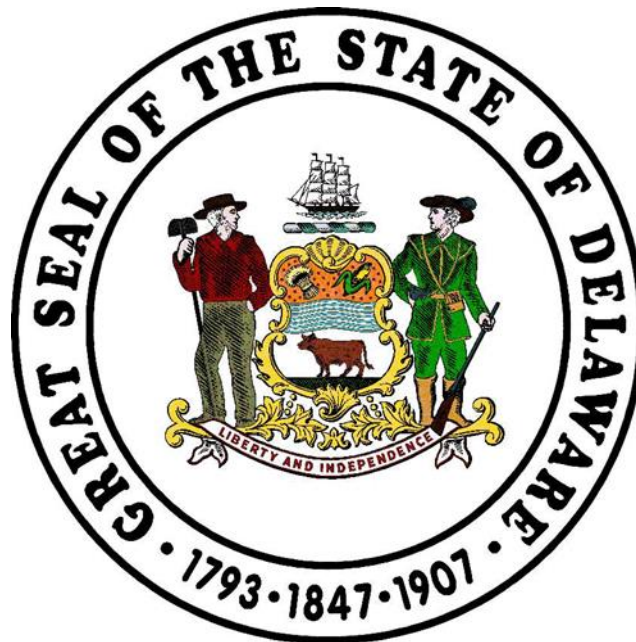

*Crime in Delaware: 2018 – 2022* is the official report of serious crimes known to Delaware law enforcement from 2018 through 2022. The report provides extensive data about crime at state and county levels. This supplement reflects an evolving effort within the *Crime in Delaware* reporting process to provide extensive crime data about the City of Wilmington.

The methods used to prepare and analyze Wilmington’s data are the same as those described in the main *Crime in Delaware* report, with one exception: data for Wilmington’s two enforcement agencies—the Wilmington Police Department and the Wilmington Fire Marshall—were first merged before analyzing the city’s data.

In this supplement, tables and figures with summary level data about offenses, clearances, and arrests are presented first. These are followed by detailed data tables with counts of offenses, clearances, and adult and juvenile arrests (Tables 3 – 6). Summaries of key findings from each level of data are also included and precede the two sections.

**Note: Caution should be used when comparing criminal offense trends involving 2020/2021 totals. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent State of Emergency declarations, court closings, and travel restrictions within the State of Delaware, it is not possible to discern if, or how much, those events impacted year-to-year changes in offense totals.**

**Note: Use caution when interpreting data for the Fraud crimes of Identity Theft and Hacking/Computer Invasion.** Issues with the way these crimes were coded in the downloaded data accounts for the drastic swing in the counts for these crimes. The SAC does not yet have a means for correcting these counts.

## Wilmington Serious Crime At-a-Glance 2018 – 2022

Overall, 2,853 fewer Group A offenses were reported in Wilmington in 2022 compared to 2018, a decline of 24.4%, continuing a long downward trend (see Table 1 and Figure 1). All major crime categories were lower in 2022 compared to 2018, with the greatest declines in Serious Property Offenses (31.8%), Other Property and Social Offenses (24.4%), and Violent Offenses (23.8%). Drug Offenses declined by 14.5% during this period. Long-term trends since 2011 can be seen in Figure 1A. Figure 1B presents long-term trends just for the four offense categories to allow for easier differentiation between those categories.

The most frequently reported offenses in the city were Assault; Larceny/Theft; Property Destruction/Vandalism; Drug/Narcotic; Burglary; and Weapon Law Violations, with all experiencing decreases compared to 2018. Larceny/Theft and Property Destruction/Vandalism decreased by more than 30% each, with Assault and Burglary decreasing by at least 20%. Drug offenses were 15% lower, while Weapon Law Violations decreased 4% (but a 13% decrease from 2021 to 2022). Long-term trends since 2011 can be seen in Figure 2. The number of homicides in 2022 (20) was 15% lower compared 2018, but 50% lower than the record high set in 2021.

2022 offenses in all main crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to those from 2018 through 2021 (see Table 1 and Figure 3). Overall, 39.3% of all offenses committed in 2022 were cleared by the end of the calendar year with 54.9% of Violent Offenses cleared and 85.1% of Drug Offenses cleared. Long-term clearance trends as recorded by the end of the calendar year can be seen in Figure 3.

The number of adult and juvenile arrests decreased from 2018 to 2022 (12.9% and 24.6%, respectively). Yearly arrest totals vary from year to year. Total arrests for Drug Offenses decreased 19.5% from 2018 to 2022, far exceeding the overall State difference for this period (-0.9). Long term trends in arrests can also be seen in Figure 3.

### **Drug Offense Changes**

Note: In December 2015, Delaware passed legislation that decriminalized certain marijuana possession offenses. Depending on various circumstances, these offenses are civil offenses. Due to the Federal Government still recording these offenses as criminal, they are part of the Drug Offense totals in this report. Depending on the circumstances surrounding those offenses, an arrest may not be made due to some possession offenses being deemed “civil offenses” by the State of Delaware.

Figure 1A: Serious Crime in Wilmington by Category, 2011 – 2022

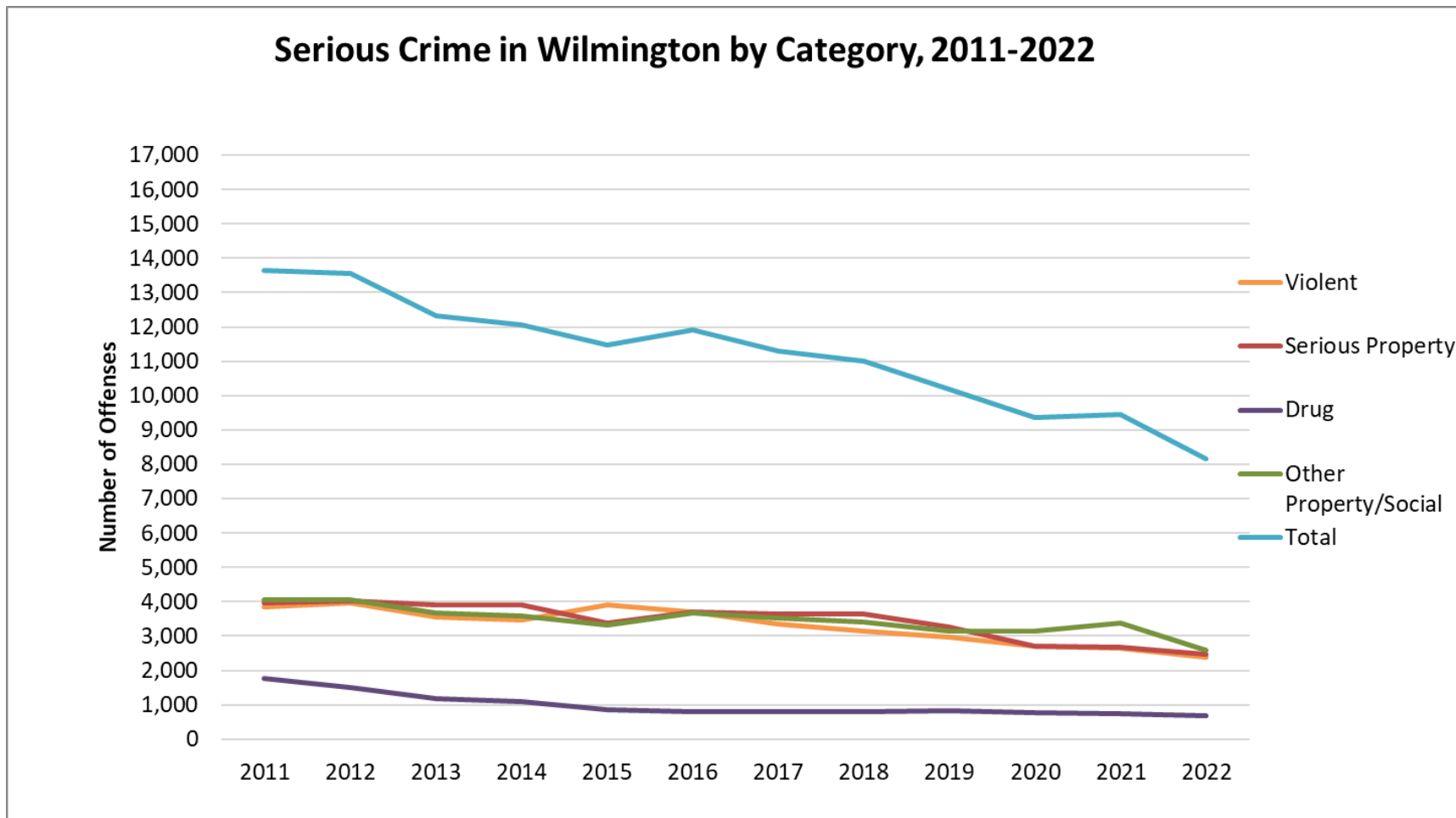


Figure 1B: Serious Crime in Wilmington by Category, 2011 – 2022 (Categories Only)

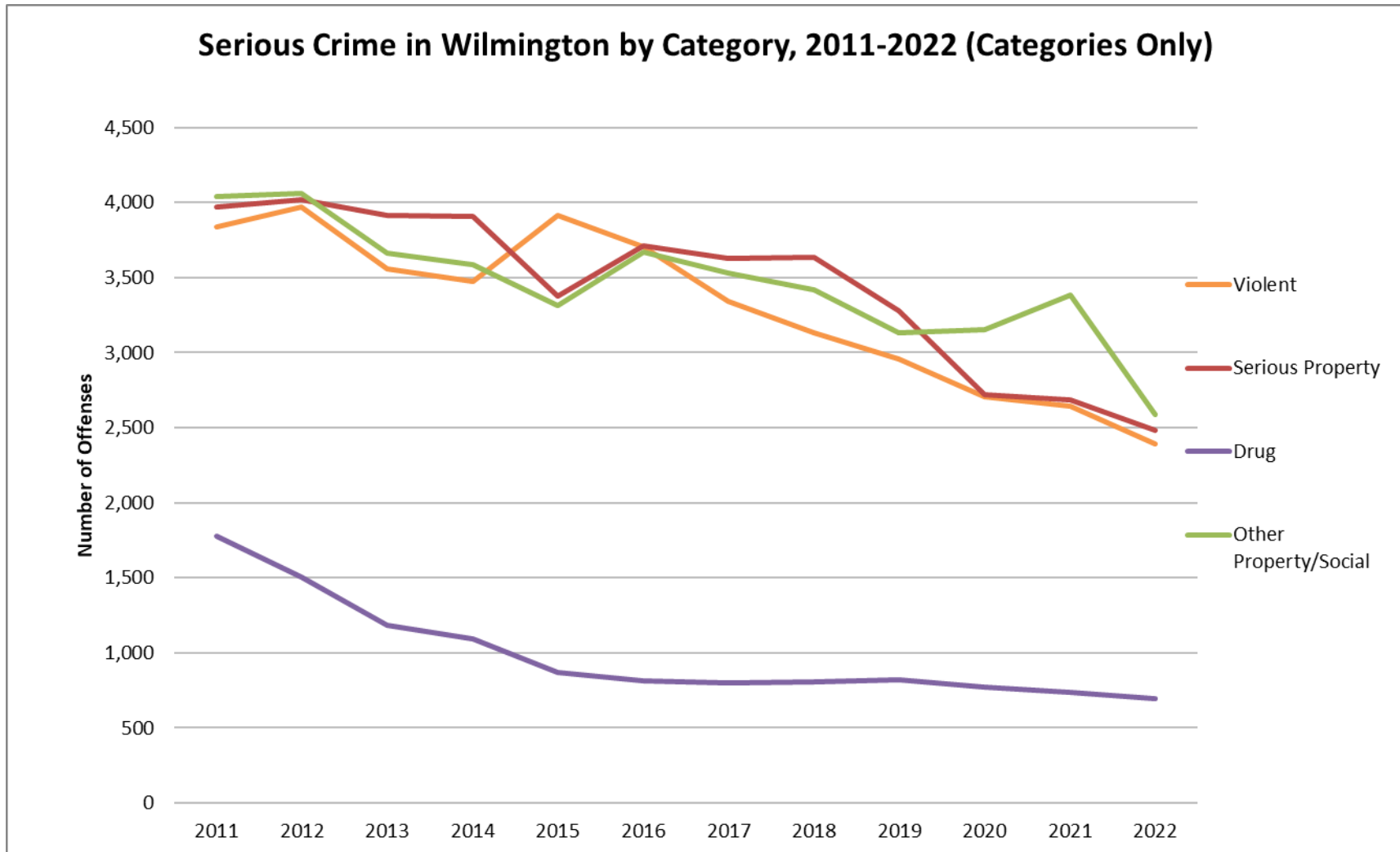

Figure 2: Most Common Serious Crimes in Wilmington, 2011 – 2022

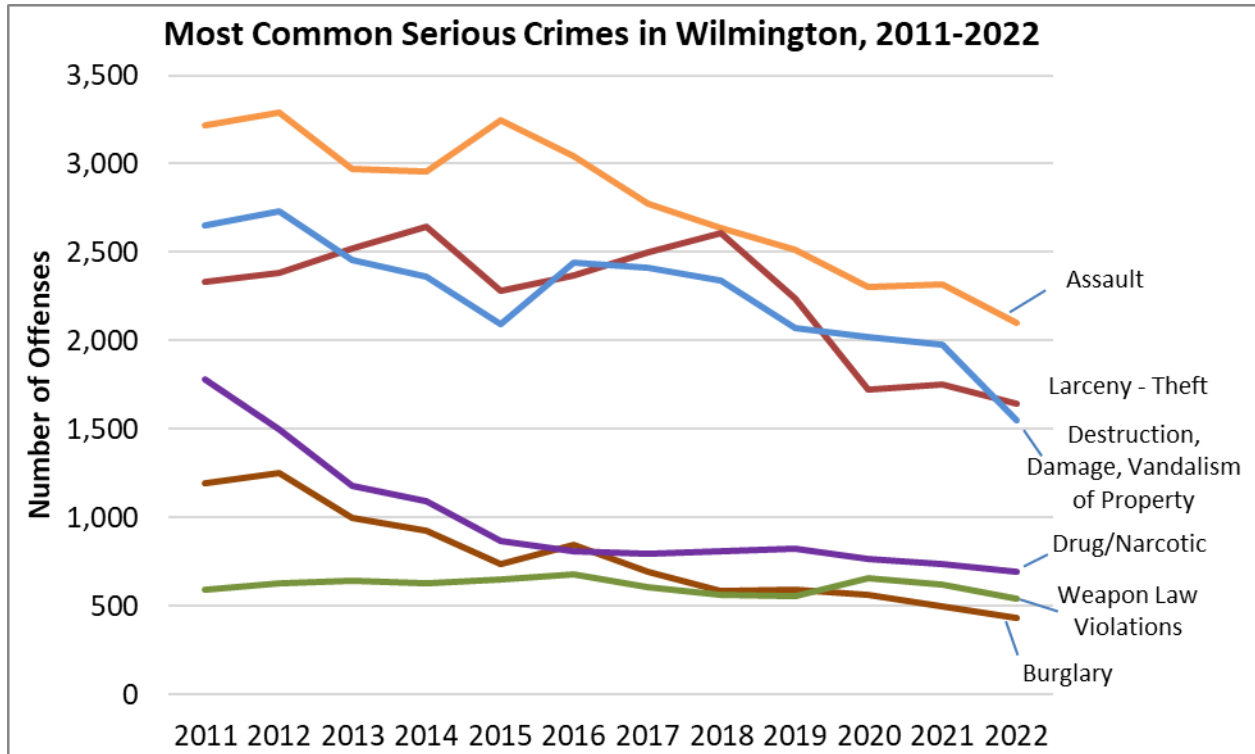
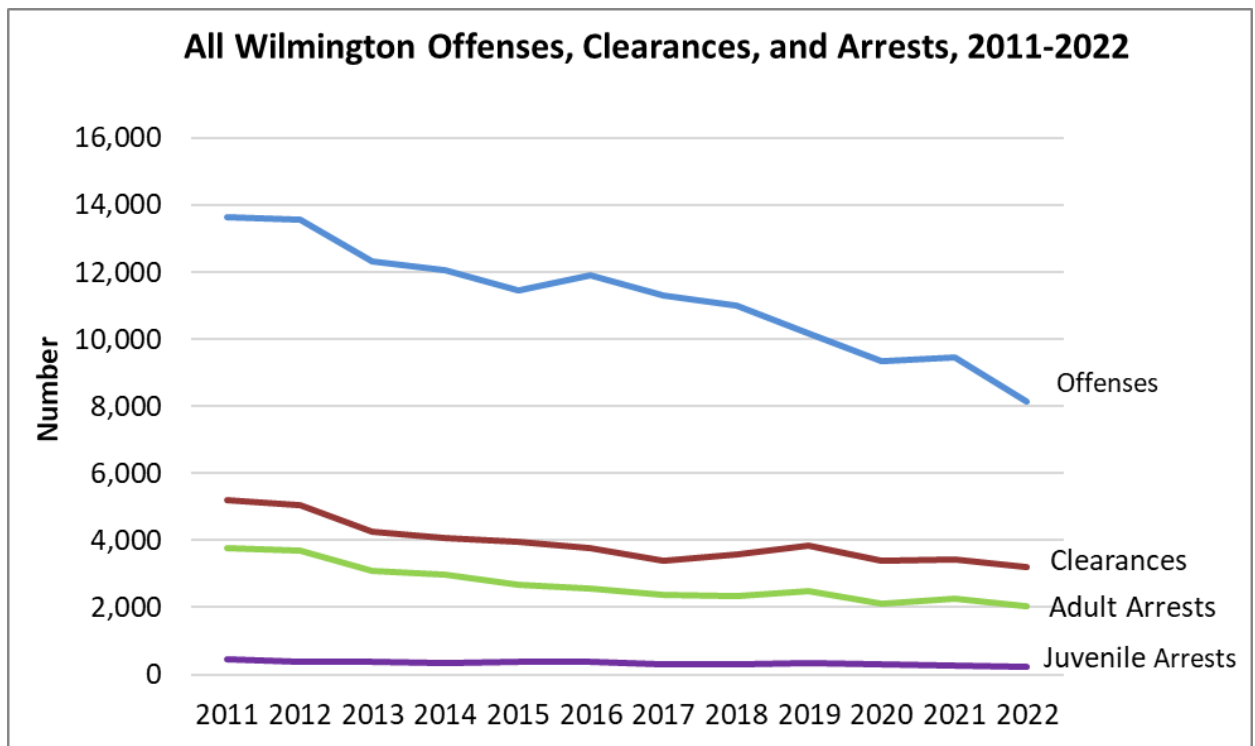


Figure 3: All Wilmington Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2011 – 2022



## **A Detailed Look at Crime in Wilmington**

The following section provides more detailed information about serious crime in Wilmington. Included is a summary of notable findings for specific crimes within the four crime categories (Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Other Property and Social Offenses) along with tables that provide detailed counts of Offenses, Clearances, and Adult and Juvenile arrests.

### ***Violent Offenses***

- The number of 2022 Criminal Homicides (20) is the lowest of the report period, down from the record set in 2021 (40).
- Forcible Sex Offenses were 60.8% lower in 2022 as compared to 2018, and a low for the 5-year report period.
- Assault and Robbery Offenses both decreased (20.4% and 42.5%, respectively) compared to 2018. Robbery Offenses are at an all-time low since this report began in 2002.
- Assault Offenses that involved the use of a firearm were 2.3% lower compared to 2018 but decreased 36.2% from 2021 to 2022. Robbery Offenses involving a firearm are down 50.4%, a low since reporting started in 2002.

***Note: In 2019 the FBI began including Vehicular Homicides under the Criminally Negligent Manslaughter category. Those offenses were not previously included in the NIBRS Homicide summary totals. This change has had minimal effect on Wilmington Homicide totals to date.***

### ***Serious Property Offenses***

- Burglary offenses were 25.7% lower in 2022 compared to 2018.
- The number of all Larceny/Theft Offenses in 2022 was 37.0% lower compared with 2018.
- Within that subcategory of crime:
  - Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts/Accessories climbed 125.3% from 2018 to 2022, with the majority of this increase occurring in 2021.
  - The number of Theft from a Building Offenses was 20.9% lower than 2018.
  - The number of Shoplifting Offenses in 2022 decreased from a high in 2019, and 37.6% from 2018 totals.
  - The number of Theft from a Motor Vehicle decreased 63.0% since 2018.

### ***Drug/Narcotic Offenses***

- Total Drug Offenses in Wilmington were down 14.5% overall from 2018 to 2022.
- Drug/Narcotic Possession offenses decreased 16.6%, while Drug Equipment offenses were essentially unchanged (an increase of 1.0%).

### ***Other Property and Social Offenses***

- The number of total Fraud Offenses was essentially unchanged (-0.8) from 2018 to 2022.
- Property Destruction/Vandalism offenses decreased 33.9% and are at a 5-year low.
- Weapon Law Violations were 3.6% lower compared to 2018.
