

## GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Adult	A person 18 years of age or older.
Arrest	A person physically apprehended, cited, or served with a summons related to a reportable offense.
Arrest Rate	The number of arrests reported per 1,000 people. $\frac{\text{arrests}}{\text{population}} \times 1,000$
Clearance	For crime reporting and analysis purposes, an offense is considered 'cleared' or solved when a suspect is either arrested and subsequently referred for prosecution or cannot be arrested but is otherwise clearly identifiable. This term is more fully explained in the body and the appendix of this report.
Crime Incident	One or more crimes/offenses committed by the same offender, or group of offenders at the same time and place. A Crime Incident may involve more than one reported offense.
Crime Rate	The number of crimes/offenses per 1,000 people. $\frac{\text{offenses}}{\text{population}} \times 1,000$
Drug/Narcotic Offenses	The violation of laws prohibiting the production, distribution, and/or use of certain controlled substances and the equipment or devices utilized in their preparation and/or use.
Ethnicity	Ethnic origin, regardless of race, identified as either Hispanic/Latino or not Hispanic/Latino.
Group A Offenses	24 serious crimes ranging from arson through assault, burglary, vandalism, drug offenses, fraud, homicide, and forcible sex offenses. Group A detailed information is based on each charge in a crime incident.
Group B Offenses	11 offenses ranging from bad checks to non-violent family offenses. Group B offenses only have arrestee data recorded in NIBRS.
Juvenile	A person under 18 years of age.
Offenses Received (Charges)	Crimes/offenses reported to or otherwise known to police. Each charge in a crime incident is counted.
Property Offenses	Property Offenses are crimes based on the main criminal objective to obtain money, property, or some other benefit.
Social Offenses	Social Offenses represent certain types of criminal activity prohibited by our society (e.g., gambling, prostitution-related offenses).
Type of Crime	The specific category to which a crime/offense belongs. For <i>Crime in Delaware</i> , these categories are Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug/Narcotic Offenses, and Other Property and Social Offenses.
Violent Offenses	Violent Offenses are defined as those crimes which involve force or threat of force. They are Murder and Non-negligent Manslaughter, Human Trafficking, Kidnapping, Forcible Sex Offenses, Robbery, and Assault.

# EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

*Crime in Delaware* is the official report of serious crime known to Delaware law enforcement agencies. This report provides information about 24 Violent, Serious Property, Drug/Narcotic and Other Property and Social Offenses reported in Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS) operated by the State Bureau of Identification of the Delaware State Police. Data for the years 2020 through 2024 are included in this report. Also, as appropriate, data for the years 2013 through 2019 are added to illustrate long-term trends.

## Key Findings/Trends

**Overall, serious crime has decreased since 2020.** The number of serious criminal offenses known to police in 2024 was 64,583 compared to 66,569 in 2020, a decrease of 3%.

**Violent crime in the State increased 7% from 2020 to 2024, though the general overall long-term trend is one of decline.**

**There were 65 statewide homicides in 2024**<sup>1</sup>—59 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 4 Vehicular Homicide, 2 Negligent Manslaughter by Other. The number of Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was 20% lower compared to 2020, but 37% higher compared to 2023.<sup>2</sup>

**Serious Property Offenses decreased 5% between 2020 and 2024.** Burglary Offenses decreased 26% from 2020 to 2024.

**Drug Possession Offenses decreased 31% from 2020 to 2024.** Drug Equipment Offenses decreased slightly (2%).

**The number Other Property and Social Offenses in 2024 was essentially unchanged compared to 2020.** One of the most common offenses, Fraud, increased 3%, while another common offense—Weapon Law Violations—decreased 10%.

**Three of the most frequently reported crimes—Assault Offenses, Larceny/Theft, and Property Destruction/Vandalism exhibited mixed trends from 2020 to 2024.** Larceny/Theft and Property Destruction/Vandalism decreased 5% and 4%, respectively. Assault Offenses, however, increased 10% over this time period.

**Based on 2024 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to the rates from 2020 through 2023.** In 2024, 52.2% of offenses were cleared by the end of the year.

# INTRODUCTION

*Crime in Delaware* is the official report of serious crime reported to Delaware law enforcement agencies. This report covers data on serious crimes that were reported to Delaware's state, county, and local police agencies for the years 2020 through 2024.

The report is divided into the following sections:

- A summary of serious crime data at the state and county levels.
- A detailed data section with information about serious offenses, clearance rates, arrests, law enforcement agency staffing, and violent crimes committed against law enforcement officers.
- A Technical Appendix with a detailed discussion of clearance rates, along with a glossary of crime definitions and National Criminal Information Center (NCIC) crime codes.

*Crime in Delaware* provides data about the 24 Group A Offenses reported in Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS). These offenses include Drug/Narcotic Offenses and 23 other specific crimes/crime categories listed below:

# METHODOLOGY

## Data Sources

Data for this report were drawn from two sources:

- The State Bureau of Identification (SBI) of the Delaware State Police, which maintains Delaware's implementation of the National Incident-Based Reporting System (for simplicity, is referred to as 'NIBRS' in the data section of this report), where offense, clearance, arrest, and crimes against law enforcement officers are derived. SBI is also the source of law enforcement agency staffing numbers.
- The Delaware Population Consortium, from which state and county population figures are drawn.

The Delaware NIBRS data files for 2024 (run by SBI on April 22, 2025) were downloaded from the Delaware Department of Technology and Information secure document library on the same day.

## Preparing the Data for Inclusion in *Crime in Delaware*

### *Checking Data Quality*

Single-year NIBRS data files and reports prepared by SBI are not in a production-ready/user-friendly format, nor do they contain the various statistics (differences, crime rates, percentages) that *Crime in Delaware* includes. Historically, the SAC downloaded summary data reports as text files, imported them to Microsoft Excel, then cleaned and transformed them so that the summary data could be collated across years and examined at the state and county levels using appropriate computations and calculations.

However, beginning with the 2018-2022 report, the SAC has instituted a new, faster, and more efficient process. Instead of summary reports, the SAC downloaded the offense-level data files that SBI uses to create the summary reports. Using *R: A Language and Environment for Statistical Computing*,<sup>4</sup> the process of checking and preparing data and computing summary statistics was automated, as was a substantial portion of the process of generating report tables. For the current report, the SAC refined the process to fully automate the creation of publication-ready tables.

*R* continues to provide substantial savings in staff time and effort, along with increased accuracy in the process of moving from downloaded data files to final tables and figures.

## Statistical Refinements

*Adoption of R:* While not a statistical refinement *per se*, the adoption of *R* (mentioned above) allows for increased accuracy in proceeding from downloaded data files to finished data tables and figures by removing most of the manual effort that process previously required. As *R* is further incorporated into the Center's work, we anticipate making additional statistical refinements in future *Crime in Delaware* reports.

## Notes and Important Considerations

Data in this report reflect only the serious crimes known to police (i.e., have been reported to the police or that police have observed). Some serious crime incidents are never reported or detected. Other serious crime incidents may only be reported or detected months or years after they occurred. The numbers in this report should, therefore, be considered as a floor estimate—that is, there was at least as much serious crime as noted in this report, likely more. Less serious offenses, for which NIBRS only contains arrest data, are not included in this report.

### CAUTION REGARDING COVID

Since the 2017-2021 *Crime in Delaware* report, the Center has encouraged caution when interpreting statistics from 2020 and 2021 and comparing trends based on the totals for those years. Due to the COVID-19 pandemic and subsequent State of Emergency declarations, court closings, and travel restrictions within the State of Delaware, it was previously not possible to discern if, or how much, those events impacted year-to-year changes in offense totals, though the data suggested differential impacts on crime and arrests.

However, as more regional, national and international research has emerged on the pandemic's impact on police agencies, correctional systems, judicial systems, and on crime (e.g., Police Executive Research Forum, 2021; Lum, Maupin, & Stoltz, 2022), some patterns have become evident that can inform an exploration of the relationship between the pandemic and Delaware crime during 2020 and 2021. While such an exploration could not be undertaken within the timeframe of this iteration of *Crime in Delaware*, the SAC intends to explore such trends before the next report.

It is important to reiterate that caution for both the 2020-2024 and 2021-2025 report series: for this report and the next, data for a pandemic year will serve as the baseline year for the five-year comparisons. For some crimes, 2020 values will be significantly elevated compared to previous years, while for others, 2020 values may be substantially lower. Also, arrest counts generally appear to have been suppressed in 2020 as compared to what would be expected based on prior year data. It is important, therefore, to not draw any conclusions based just on differences between 2020 and 2024 without first carefully examining the longer-term trends in the data.

**Additional caution should be used in drawing conclusions** about changes in the occurrence of serious crime based on the data in this report. The following considerations should be kept in mind:

- **NIBRS data in this report reflect the number of offenses/charges rather than unique criminal incidents.** A single criminal incident can result in a single charge filed by police or multiple charges depending on what criminal behaviors occur during the incident and the characteristics of the incident itself (e.g., the number of victims and alleged offenders).
- **Crime Rate figures (i.e., the number of crimes per 1,000 people) are best viewed in the context of other crime and population data.** The Crime Rate reflects not just the change in the number of offenses known to law enforcement officers but the change in the population as well. Even if the number of offenses has not changed from one year to the next, changes in population will make it appear that crime has decreased (in the event of a population increase) or that it has increased (if the population decreases). The Crime Rate, when used by itself, can create a distorted picture of crime.
- **Use caution in comparing jurisdictions, counties, and states.** Differences in community socioeconomic factors, population trends, and how law enforcement agencies operate (in charging practices when an arrest is made; in interpreting crime definitions; in enforcement priorities, etc.) can vary greatly among communities, all of which create challenges in making accurate and valid comparisons. Also, participation in NIBRS is voluntary and not all states choose to participate; even among many states that participate, not all jurisdictions elect to take part. Where crime data for a state are not complete, the FBI must create estimates to account for those data gaps.

The FBI says it best in the introductory note to its *Preliminary Annual Uniform Crime Report, January-December, 2012*<sup>5</sup>:

“Individuals ... are cautioned against drawing conclusions by making direct comparisons between cities. Comparisons lead to simplistic and/or incomplete analyses that often create misleading perceptions adversely affecting communities and their residents. Valid assessments are possible only with careful study and analysis of the range of unique conditions affecting each local law enforcement jurisdiction. ... remember that crime is a social problem and, therefore, a concern of the entire community. The efforts of law enforcement are limited to factors within its control. The data user is, therefore, cautioned against comparing statistical data of individual agencies.”

- **Arrest data for Negligent Manslaughter: Vehicular Homicide offenses for 2020 through 2022, and Human Trafficking arrest data for 2022 were not available in the downloaded arrest data files.** The Center could not arrive at satisfactory arrest counts for these two crimes through alternative means, as a result no arrest data are included for those crimes in this report for those years.

- ***Use caution when interpreting data for the Fraud crimes of Identity Theft and Hacking/Computer Invasion.*** Issues with the way these crimes were coded in the downloaded data accounts for the drastic swing in the counts for these crimes. The SAC does not yet have a means for correcting these counts.

### **A Note About Clearances/Clearance Rates**

The federal definition of *clearance rate* is the percentage of offenses received that are 'solved' through an arrest or by exceptional means. An offense is 'cleared by arrest' for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to a court for prosecution.

In certain situations, an offender is known but is not or cannot be arrested and formally charged. When this happens, the offense can be cleared by *exceptional means*. Such situations include, but are not limited to, offender death or confession; an offender who cannot be extradited from another jurisdiction; refusal of a victim to cooperate in a prosecution; handling a juvenile offender through an alternative police policy.

It is important to keep in mind that the arrest or identification of one offender may clear multiple offenses. Alternatively, multiple arrests may clear only a single offense.

## SERIOUS CRIME AT-A-GLANCE

This section of the report provides summary-level data about serious crime in Delaware and in the state's three counties for the years 2020 to 2024. Included in this section are data about the total number of serious offenses and the four major categories of crime: Violent Offenses, Serious Property Offenses, Drug Offenses, and Other Property and Social Offenses.

The specific topics addressed in this section are as follows:

- offenses received by law enforcement agencies
- offense clearances
- crime rates
- differences in the number of offenses received between years
- total arrests and arrests of adults and juveniles; and
- assaults against law enforcement officers.

All state-level summary data, organized by the topics above, are presented first. All summary data, again organized by topic, are then presented for each county. More detailed data about offenses and clearances, arrests, and assaults against law enforcement officers can be found in the '...Detailed Look at Serious Crime...' section beginning on page 31.

### Note to the reader

As noted earlier in this report, please use caution when comparing Delaware's data to national data or those for other states. Crime data, particularly crime rates, are best understood in the context of other data.

## **Delaware Serious Crime at-a-Glance, 2020 – 2024**




Figure 2: Final Differences in Serious Criminal Offenses, by State and County, 2020 and 2024

Overall, there were 1,986 fewer reported serious Group A Offenses in 2024 compared to 2020, a 3% decrease (see Table 1 and Figure 1). Two of the four crime categories were lower compared to 2020: Drug Offenses (22.4%) and Serious Property Offenses (4.9%). Violent Offenses increased 7% over the same period, while the number of Other Property and Social Offenses was essentially unchanged (-0.3%). Long-term trends in offenses since 2013 are also presented in Figure 1. Crime category differences from 2020 to 2024 for Delaware are presented in Figure 2.

Other Property and Social Offenses were the most frequently reported category of crimes in 2024 (30.6%), followed by Serious Property Offenses (29.9%), Violent Offenses (28.1%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (11.4%). Although the proportions fluctuated slightly, the order from least to most common category remained the same.




Figure 3: Most Common Serious Crimes in Delaware, 2013 – 2024

The most frequently reported offenses were Assault; Larceny/Theft; Property Destruction/Vandalism; and Drug/Narcotic. Three of those crimes declined from 2020 to 2024, with Drug Offenses experiencing the most dramatic decline (22.4%). Larceny/Theft declined 5.2%, and Property Destruction/Vandalism by 4.4%. The number of Assault offenses increased 9.5%. Trends since 2013 can be seen in Figure 3, and the underlying data can be found in the four detailed Delaware sections later in the report.




Figure 4: All Delaware Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024

Based on 2024 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to the rates from 2020 through 2023 (see Table 1 and Figure 4). Offenses in the Drug/Narcotic and Violent Offense categories continue to be cleared at high rates (94.6% and 77.5%, respectively). Overall, 52.2% of the offenses committed in 2024 were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Trends since 2013 can be seen in Figure 4.

The number of arrests from 2020 to 2024 was higher for three of the four categories. Arrests for the Serious Property, Other Property and Social Offenses, Violent Offenses categories were all higher (3.9%, 15.5%, and 7.3%, respectively). Arrests for Drug Offenses were 5.4% lower.

In 2024, 411 assault-related offenses were committed against law enforcement officers, 3.3% higher when compared to 2020, with no officers killed. Nearly all violent offenses against law enforcement officers were cleared by the end of the calendar year (93.4%). Figure 5 illustrates the long-term trends in assaults against Delaware law enforcement officers.

Figure 1: Serious Crime in Delaware by Category, 2013 – 2024




## New Castle County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2020 – 2024

Overall, there were 3,732 fewer reported serious Group A Offenses in the county in 2024 compared to 2020, a decline of 10.1% (see Table 4 and Figure 6). All four categories decreased, with the greatest declines for Drug Offenses (38.3%) and Serious Property Offenses (9.8%). Violent Offenses and Other Property and Social Offenses both decreased by 5% compared to 2024. Long-term trends in offenses since 2013 are presented in Figure 6.

Serious Property Offenses and Other Property/Social Offenses were the two most frequently reported crime categories in the county in 2024, 34.1% and 33%, respectively, followed by Violent Offenses (25.4%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (7.5%).




Figure 7: Most Common Serious Crimes in New Castle County, 2013 – 2024

The most frequently reported offenses in the county in 2024 were Larceny/Theft; Assault; Property Destruction/Vandalism; Fraud; Drug/Narcotic; and Burglary. All six of these offenses saw varying decreases compared to 2020. Drug Offenses, and Burglary decreased 38.3% and 31.1%, respectively. The remaining offenses decreased between 1.6% and 11%. Figure 7 displays the long-term trends in these offenses since 2013, and the underlying data can be found in the four detailed New Castle County sections later in the report.





Figure 8: All New Castle County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024

Based on 2024 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to previous years (see Table 4 and Figure 8). Offenses in the Drug and Violent categories continue to be cleared at high rates (90.6% and 70.5%, respectively). Overall, 43.2% of all offenses committed in 2024 were cleared by the end of the year. Trends since 2013 can be seen in Figure 8.

Total arrests in the county were 2% lower compared to 2020 (see Table 5 and Figure 8). Juvenile arrests showed an overall increase of 10.6%, but a 5.9% decrease compared to 2023. The number of adult arrests decreased 3.4%. Trends in arrests since 2013 can also be seen in Figure 8.

The number of law enforcement officers assaulted in 2024 was 209, an 11.4% decrease compared to 2020. No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2024, and there were no attempted homicides of officers. Assault-related offenses continued to be cleared at very high rates (91.9%). Long-term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime At-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).

Figure 6: Serious Crime in New Castle County by Category, 2013 – 2024

## Kent County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2020 – 2024

Overall, there were 1,921 more reported serious Group A Offenses in Kent County in 2024 compared to 2020, an increase of 14.2% (see Table 7 and Figure 9). All four crime categories increased compared to 2020, with Violent Offenses and Serious Property Offenses experiencing the largest increases (24.2% and 14.9%, respectively). Drug Offenses and Other Property Social Offenses each decreased by less than 10%. Compared to 2023, three of the four categories also increased, but by single digits.

Serious Property Offenses and Violent Offenses were the most frequently reported categories of crime in Kent County in 2024 (29.6% and 29.5%, respectively), followed by Other Property and Social Offenses (26.2%), and Drug/Narcotic Offenses (14.7%).




Figure 10: Most Common Serious Crimes in Kent County, 2013 – 2024

Four of the most frequently reported offenses for the county in 2024—Assault; Larceny/Theft; Drug/Narcotic; and Fraud—experienced increases in 2024 compared to 2020 (26.4%, 18.5%, 4.7%, and 1.8%, respectively). Burglary and Property Destruction/Vandalism declined 26.9% and 2.4%). Figure 10 portrays the long-term trends of offenses since 2013, and the underlying data can be found in the four detailed Kent County sections later in the report.





Figure 11: All Kent County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024

Based on 2024 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to those from 2020 through 2023 (see Table 7 and Figure 11). Offenses in the Drug and Violent categories continue to be cleared at high rates (96.9% and 83%, respectively). Overall, 60.6% of all offenses committed in 2024 had been cleared by the end of the calendar year. Trends since 2013 can be seen in Figure 11.

The total number of arrests in the county increased by 24.4% from 2020 through 2024, but with small consecutive increases since 2021 (see Table 8 and Figure 11). Adult arrests increased 20.5% but experienced the same pattern of increases noted above. Juvenile arrests increased 90.9%, but declined 16.8% compared to 2023. Trends in arrests since 2013 are shown in Figure 11.

The 2024 data indicate that the number of assaults against law enforcement officers was almost double compared to 2020, though the increase was just 25% when compared to 2021. (see Table 9). No officers were killed in the line of duty during 105 assaults in 2024, and there were no attempted homicides of a law enforcement officer. Most assaults against law enforcement officers in Kent County were cleared by the end of the calendar year (97.1%). Long-term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime At-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).

Figure 9: Serious Crime in Kent County by Category, 2013 – 2024

## Sussex County Serious Crime At-a-Glance, 2020 – 2024

Overall, there were 175 fewer reported serious Group A Offenses in Sussex County in 2024 compared to 2020, a decrease of 1.1% (see Table 10 and Figure 12). Two of the four crime categories—Serious Property Offenses and Drug Offenses—decreased compared to 2020 (9.6% and 20.9%, respectively). Violent Offenses and Other Property and Social Offenses increased 16% and 3.7%, respectively, for the same period. Long-term trends in offenses since 2013 are also presented in Figure 12.

Violent Offenses is the most frequently reported category in 2024 (32.1%). Other Property & Social Offenses made up 30%, Serious Property Offenses accounted for 21.6%, and Drug/Narcotic Offenses comprised 16.3%.




Figure 13: Most Common Serious Crimes in Sussex County, 2013 – 2024

The most frequently reported offenses in the county in 2024 were Assault; Larceny/Theft; Drug/Narcotic; Fraud; Property Destruction/Vandalism; and Burglary. Four of the six most frequent offenses had overall declines from 2020 to 2024 ranging from 7.5% to 20.9%. Assault increased 16.6% and Fraud by 11.9%. Figure 13 also portrays the long-term trends in these offenses since 2013, and the underlying data can be found in the four detailed Sussex County sections later in the report.





Figure 14: All Sussex County Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024

Based on 2024 data, offenses in all crime categories were cleared at rates comparable to the rates from 2020 through 2024 (see Table 10 and Figure 14). Drug and Violent Offenses continue to be cleared at high rates (96.5% and 84.2%, respectively). Overall, 62.9% of all offenses committed in 2024 had been cleared by year's end. Trends since 2013 can be seen in Figure 14.

The number of total adult arrests decreased 1.8%, while juvenile arrests increased 55.9% from 2020-2024, but just 3.6% compared to 2023 totals. Total arrests were 2.2% higher.

The 2024 data show an 11% decrease in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county compared to 2020 (see Table 12). There were 97 assaults against officers in 2024, the lowest number in the five-year reporting period. No officers were killed in the line of duty in 2024, and there were no attempted homicides on officers. Almost all of assaults against law enforcement officers were cleared by the end of the calendar year (92.8%). Long-term trends in assaults against law enforcement officers in the county can be found in Figure 5 (presented in the Delaware Serious Crime at-a-Glance section located earlier in this report).

Figure 12: Serious Crime in Sussex County by Category, 2013 – 2024

# A DETAILED LOOK AT SERIOUS CRIME IN DELAWARE

The following sections provide more detailed information about serious crime in Delaware. Each section has a single topic focus: one of the four crime categories and violent crimes against law enforcement officers. Within each crime category section, statewide data on offenses, clearances, and arrests are presented first, followed by the same data for each county. The section on crimes against law enforcement officers presents the state and county data relevant to this topic.

A note about homicide counts: The homicide counts included in this report reflect an undercount of known incidents. Per the State Bureau of Identification, the Delaware NIBRS program manager, 3 homicide reports—1 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter (New Castle), 2 Vehicle Homicides (Sussex)—had not been finalized by the respective reporting agencies by the FBI's final data submission deadline. As a result, those incidents were not included in the data files downloaded and analyzed for Crime in Delaware. They will be included in SBI's next data file update and the corrected 2024 values will be updated in the 2025 Crime in Delaware Reports.

## Note to the reader

As noted earlier in this report, please use caution when comparing Delaware's data to national data or those for other states. Crime data, particularly crime rates, are best understood in the context of other data.

## REMINDER: CAUTION REGARDING COVID

As regional, national and international research has emerged on the COVID-19 pandemic's impact on police agencies, correctional systems, judicial systems, and on crime, some patterns have become evident that can inform an exploration of the relationship between the pandemic and Delaware crime during 2020 and 2021. Such an exploration could not be undertaken within the timeframe of this iteration of *Crime in Delaware*; however, the SAC intends to explore such trends before the next report.

It is important to reiterate that caution for both the 2020-2024 and 2021-2025 report series: for this report and the next, data for a pandemic year will serve as the baseline year for the five-year comparisons. For some crimes, 2020 values will be significantly elevated compared to previous years, while for others, 2020 values may be substantially lower. Also, arrest counts generally appear to have been suppressed in 2020 as compared to what would be expected based on prior year data. It is important, therefore, to not draw any conclusions based just on differences between 2020 and 2024 without first carefully examining the longer-term trends in the data.

## Delaware Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses were 7% higher in 2024 when compared with 2020, and a slight increase (1.3%) over 2023. The two most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Assault and Robbery—experienced mixed patterns of change. While Robbery decreased 30.3%, Assault offenses increased 9.5% (driven largely by a 13.6% increase in Other Assaults).

There were 65 statewide homicides in 2024: 59 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 4 Vehicular Homicide, 2 Negligent Manslaughter by Other. The number of Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was 20.3% lower compared to 2020, but 37.2% higher than 2023 (which had the lowest number for the five-year reporting period).

Assaults with a Firearm were 27.9% lower compared to 2020, and Robbery with a Firearm decreased 35.1%.

Most Kidnapping and Assault offenses were cleared by the end of 2024 (87.3% and 79.1%, respectively). Almost half of Robbery offenses (48.8%), 56.9% of Criminal Homicide offenses, and 54.5% Forcible Sex Offenses (54.5%) were cleared during that period. Total Violent Offenses in 2024 were cleared at rates comparable to those for the previous four years.

Tables 13–19 and Figure 15 provide information about Statewide Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 15.

**Figure 15: Delaware Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## New Castle County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the County were 4.6% lower in 2024 when compared with 2020. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Assault, Robbery, and Forcible Sex Offenses—experienced declines of 1.6%, 39.2%, and 5.1%, respectively. The change in Assists reflects a decrease of 16.7% in Aggravated Assists which was offset by a 3.7% increase in Other Assists (which are less serious offenses but more numerous).

There were 39 homicides in New Castle County in 2024: 35 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 3 Vehicular Homicide, and 1 Other Negligent Manslaughter. The number of Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was 34% lower compared to 2020, but 45.8% higher compared to 2023, which had the lowest number for the five-year reporting period.

Assault with a Firearm offenses decreased 42% since 2020, Robbery with a Firearm offenses by 37.5%.

Seventy percent of all Violent Offenses were cleared by the end of the calendar year. Overall, Violent Offenses in 2024 were cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years. Just over half of all Homicide offenses and 41.5% of Robbery offenses were cleared during that period. Most Kidnapping and Assault offenses had been cleared by the end of 2024 (84.1% and 72.5%, respectively).

Tables 20 – 26 and Figure 16 provide detailed information about New Castle County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 16.

**Figure 16: New Castle County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## Kent County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the county increased 24.2% in 2024 when compared with 2020. Out of the three most common crimes, Robbery and Assault offenses increased 27.1% and 26.4%, respectively, from 2020. Forcible Sex Offenses decreased 10.2%. The increase in Assault offenses was largely driven by the Other Assault category, which increased 32.5% compared to a 3.7% increase in Aggravated Assaults.

Robbery with a Firearm offenses decreased 29.7% since 2020, Assault with a Firearm offenses by 19.2%.

There were 14 county homicides in 2024 (all Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses). The number of Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was identical to 2020, but 55.6% higher compared to 2023.

Overall, 83% of all Violent Offenses committed in 2024 had been cleared by the end of the calendar year. All crimes within the category were cleared at rates comparable to previous years.

Tables 27–33 and Figure 17 provide detailed information about Kent County Violent Offenses, Clearances, Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 17.

**Figure 17: Kent County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## Sussex County Violent Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Violent Offenses in the county were 16% higher in 2024 compared with 2020. The three most commonly reported offenses exhibited a mixed pattern of change from 2020 to 2024. Robbery offenses decreased 6.9% while Assualts increased 16.6%. The number of Forcible Sex Offenses was unchanged, but decreased 15.5% from 2023 to 2024.

There were 12 Criminal Homicides in 2024: 10 Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter, 1 Vehicular Homicide, and 1 other Negligent Manslaughter. The number of Murder/Non-Negligent Manslaughter offenses was 42.9% higher compared to 2020, but identical to 2023, the report period high.

All four categories of Aggravated Assault offenses increased. Aggravated Assualts, overall, showed a 21.6% increase from 2020. Other Assualts (the other main category of Assualts) increased 15.7%.

With respect to firearm use in the most common Violent Offenses, Robbery with a Firearm offenses were down 14.3% from 2020. Aggravated Assualt with a Firearm increased 29.6% over the same period.

Most Violent Offenses (84.2%) had been cleared by the end of 2024. Most categories of Violent Offenses committed in 2024 were cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.

Tables 34–40 and Figure 18 provide detailed information about Sussex County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends from 2013 are shown in Figure 18.

**Figure 18: Sussex County Violent Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## Delaware Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses were 4.9% lower in 2024 when compared with 2020, continuing an overall downward trend. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Larceny/Theft, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Burglary—had mixed trends compared to 2020. Burglary and Larceny/Theft Offenses experienced decreases of 25.7% and 5.2%, respectively, compared with 2020. The number of Motor Vehicle Theft Offenses, however, increased 26.1% since 2020.

The three most common Larceny/Theft offenses—Shoplifting, Theft from a Building, and Theft from a Motor Vehicle—exhibited a mixed pattern of change. Shoplifting and Theft from a Building increased from 2020 to 2024 (31.5%, and 3.7%, respectively). However, Theft from a Motor Vehicle and the fourth most common category, Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts and/or Accessories—experienced decreases of 46% and 36.2%, respectively.

For all Serious Property Offense crimes, 29.6% of offenses had been cleared by the end of 2024. However, offenses for almost all crimes in this category were generally cleared at rates comparable to those for the previous four years.

Tables 41 – 47 and Figure 19 provide detailed information about Statewide Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 19.

**Figure 19: Delaware Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## New Castle County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were 9.8% lower in 2024 when compared with 2020. Two of the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Larceny/Theft and Burglary—decreased significantly, 11% and 31.1%, respectively. The number of Motor Vehicle Theft offenses, however, increased 21.8% compared to 2020, but decreased 16.3% compared to 2023.

The three most common Larceny offenses—Shoplifting, Theft from a Building, and Theft from a Motor Vehicle showed a mixed pattern of change compared to 2020. Theft from a Motor Vehicle and Theft from a Building each decreased (50.2% and 1.8%, respectively), while Shoplifting increased 38.2%.

Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts and Accessories decreased substantially (34.3%) in 2024 when compared with 2020, and were 54.2% lower compared to 2023.

Overall, 24.3% of Serious Property Offense crimes had been cleared by the end of 2024. Crimes within this category were generally cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.

Tables 48 – 54 and Figure 20 provide detailed information about New Castle County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 20.

**Figure 20: New Castle County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## Kent County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were 14.9% higher in 2024 when compared with 2020. Two of the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Larceny/Theft and Motor Vehicle Theft increased (18.5% and 38.7%, respectively) from 2020 to 2024. Burglary, the other most common crime, decreased 26.9% over the same period.

Theft from a Motor Vehicle decreased 39.5% from 2020 to 2024, while Shoplifting offenses increased 44.5%. Theft from a Building offenses increased 30.4% since 2020.

For all Serious Property Offense crimes, 36.6% of offenses were cleared by the end of 2024. Most offenses within this category were cleared at rates roughly comparable to those for the previous four years.

**Figure 21: Kent County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## Sussex County Serious Property Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Serious Property Offenses in the county were 9.6% lower in 2024 when compared with 2020. Two of the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Larceny/Theft and Burglary—exhibited decreases. Larceny/Theft decreased 12.7% and Burglary declined 7.5% from 2020 to 2024. Motor Vehicle Theft offenses increased 43.4% from 2020 to 2024.

In the Larceny/Theft category, Theft from a Building decreased 13.2% since 2020. Shoplifting had an overall decrease of 3.0%. Theft From a Motor Vehicle and Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts decreased 26.4% and 31.5%, respectively.

Overall, 37.6% of Serious Property Offense crimes had been cleared by the end of 2024. However, offenses for almost all crimes in this category were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 62 – 68 and Figure 22 provide detailed information about Sussex County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 22.

**Figure 22: Sussex County Serious Property Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**





Figure 24: New Castle County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024





## Sussex County Drug and Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests

Overall, Drug/Narcotic Offenses in the county were down 20.9% in 2024 when compared to 2020. From 2020 to 2024, both Drug/Narcotic and Drug Equipment offenses decreased, 30% and 6.2%, respectively.

Overall, nearly all Drug/Narcotic offenses (96.5%) had been cleared by the end of 2024. Both crimes in this category were cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.

Tables 84 – 88 and Figure 26 provide detailed information about Sussex County Drug/Narcotic Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 26.



## Delaware Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, the number of Other Property and Social Offenses was essentially unchanged (-0.3%) in 2024 when compared with 2020, though they experienced a decrease of 8.3% when compared to 2023. The pattern of differences in offense totals from 2020 to 2024 for the three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism; Fraud; and Weapon Law Violations—were mixed. Fraud Offenses increased 2.6%, while Weapon Law Violations and Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism Offenses decreased 9.8% and 4.4%, respectively.

Overall, 35.5% of all Other Property and Social offenses had been cleared by the end of 2024. Many of the crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates near or above 50%. However, two crimes among those with the lowest clearance rates—Fraud and Property Destruction/Damage and Vandalism—accounted for 76% of the offenses in this category, contributing to the low overall clearance rate. Almost all crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates comparable to, or better than, those for the previous four years.

Tables 89 – 95 and Figure 27 provide detailed information about Statewide Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 27.

### A Note About Identity Theft and Hacking/Computer Invasion Counts

Issues with the way these crimes were coded in the downloaded data for 2021 account for the drastic swing in the counts for these crimes. The SAC does not yet have a means for correcting these counts. Overall Fraud offense totals are correct, however.

**Figure 27: Delaware Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## New Castle County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, the number of Other Property and Social Offenses in the county decreased 4.9% between 2020 and 2024, 12.2% compared to 2023. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category—Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism; Fraud; and Weapons Law Violations—all decreased from 2020 to 2024. Fraud Offenses and Property/Destruction and Vandalism experienced small decreases, 1.9% and 2.5%, respectively, compared to 2020, but saw decreases of 10.9% and 12.3% compared to 2023. Weapons Law Violations decreased 26.6% compared to 2020.

Counterfeiting/Forgery Offenses decreased 3.6% from 2020 to 2024, and continued their downward trend from the five-year period high in 2022.

Overall, 30.9% of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2024. Two crimes with some of the lowest clearance rates, Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism and Fraud account for 79% of the offenses in this category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Most other crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at much higher rates, a pattern comparable to the past four years.

Tables 96 – 102 and Figure 28 provide detailed information about New Castle County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 28.

**Figure 28: NCC Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013 – 2024**



## Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, Other Property and Social Offenses in the county were 9.1% higher in 2024 when compared to 2020. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category—Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism; Fraud; and Weapon Law Violations—were mixed from 2020 to 2024. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism decreased 2.4%, while Fraud and Weapon Law Violations increased 1.8% and 23%, respectively.

Overall, 42.2% of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2024. Many crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, two crimes with some of the lowest clearance rates, Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism and Fraud, accounted for 69% of the offenses in this category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Almost all crimes in this category of offenses were cleared at rates comparable to or better than those for the previous four years.

Tables 103 – 108 and Figure 29 provide detailed information about Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 29.

**Figure 29: Kent County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013-24**



## Sussex County Other Property and Social Offenses and Clearances

Overall, the number of Other Property and Social Offenses in the county was 3.7% higher in 2024 when compared to 2020. The three most commonly occurring crimes in this category of offenses—Fraud; Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism; and Weapon Law Violations showed mixed patterns. Property Destruction/Damage/Vandalism decreased 11.7%. Fraud and Weapon Law Violations both increased (11.9% and 24.0%, respectively) since 2020.

Overall, 40% of all Other Property and Social Offenses had been cleared by the end of 2024. Many crimes within this category of offenses were cleared at rates well above 50%. However, the crimes with some of the lowest clearance rates – Fraud and Property/Destruction/Damage/Vandalism – account for 74% of the crimes in this offense category, suppressing the overall clearance rate. Most offenses in this category were cleared at rates comparable to the previous four years.

Tables 109 – 115 and Figure 30 provide detailed information about Sussex County Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Juvenile and Adult Arrests. Long-term trends since 2013 are also presented in Figure 30.

**Figure 30: Sussex Cnty. Other Property and Social Offenses, Clearances, and Arrests, 2013-24**



# LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY STAFFING AND OFFICERS KILLED AND ASSAULTED, 2020 – 2024

This final section of the *Crime in Delaware* report examines the staffing trends among Delaware's police agencies and violent crimes committed against law enforcement officers.

## Full Time Law Enforcement Officers and Civilian Employees

The number of law enforcement officers and civilians employed in Delaware police departments and agencies totaled 2,357 and 1,178, respectively, in 2024. The law enforcement officer total decreased slightly (0.8%) between 2020 and 2024. The civilian employee total reflects an increase of 11.3% from 2020 to 2024.

In 2024, municipalities employed just over half of Delaware's officers (51%) and 25% of the civilian law enforcement employees. The Delaware State Police employed 31% of officers, and 22.2% of the civilian law enforcement employees. Special Agencies such as Capitol Police, Delaware River and Bay Authority, the State Fire Marshal along with the Attorney General's Office employed the remaining 20% of officers, and 52.7% of civilian law enforcement employees (see Table 116). Table 133 contains a full list of employee counts by jurisdiction and employee type.

\*Fluctuations in Special Agency Officer and Total Officer counts during five-year report period are largely due to variations in the frequency and consistency in which Amtrak has reported its data. Amtrak values for 2020 were problematic to such a degree that they substantially distorted the change in Officer comparison for 2020 to 2024. As a result, 2020 Amtrak counts were adjusted from 403 officers and 59 civilians to 29 officers and 26 civilians. This change also lowered the Special Agency and overall totals by 374 officers and 33 civilians.

## Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in Delaware

**Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers were up 3.3% from 2020.** Assault-related offenses were committed against police officers in 2024 (411), about average for the five-year period.

**Almost all offenses, 93.4%, had been cleared before the end of 2024.** Assaults continue to be cleared at rates around 95%. Figure 31 shows the trends in assaults against officers since 2013.

**No officers were killed in 2024, but 23.4% of assaults resulted in injuries.** There were no attempted homicides of police officers in 2024, the lowest total in the five-year period.

**Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, handling prisoners, and traffic pursuits, and most often involved single-officer vehicles.** Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners accounted for roughly 60-70% of assaults against officers during the 2020 through 2024 period. Traffic stops and pursuits were associated with an additional 7-10% of assaults during that period.

**Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers.** From 2020 to 2024, 70-80% of all assaults involved the use of hands/fists/feet as a weapon.

Figure 31: Assaults Against Law Enforcement Officers, 2013 – 2024






Figure 32: Weapons Used Against Law Enforcement Officers 2020 – 2024

## Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in New Castle County

**Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers in the county decreased from 2020 totals.** Assault-related offenses committed against officers in the county were 11.4% lower in 2024 when compared to 2020, but are 7.7% higher compared to 2023. Trends in assaults against officers in the county since 2013 can be seen in Figure 31.

**Almost all assault-related offenses (91.9%) had been cleared before the end of 2024.** Assaults against officers in the county continue to be cleared at very high rates.

**No officers were killed in 2024 in New Castle County and 18.2% of assaults on officers resulted in injuries, near the reporting-period low.** There were zero attempted homicides on officers in 2024. (Note: five of the attempted homicides in 2020 resulted from a single manhunt.)

**Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners, and most often involved single-officer vehicles.** Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners accounted for around 65% of assaults against officers in the county during the 2020 through 2024 period.

**Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers in the county, but at the lowest rate of the 5-year reporting period.** From 2020 through 2024, on average more than 70% of all assaults against officers in the county involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as a weapon. On average, 6.5% of assaults were committed using a firearm or cutting instrument from 2020 to 2024, partly driven by 2023's rate of 13.4%.

## Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in Kent County

**Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers increased almost 100% from the 5-year low in 2020.** Assault-related offenses committed against officers in 2024 (105) were also higher compared to 2021 – 2023, but to a much lesser extent. Trends in assaults against officers in the county since 2013 can be seen in Figure 31.

**Almost all assault related offenses had been cleared by the end of 2024.** Assaults against officers in the county continue to be cleared at rates of 90% or higher.

**No officers in the county were killed in 2024 but 24.8% of assault-related offenses resulted in injuries, a high for the five-year report period.** There were no attempted homicide offenses against officers in 2024. The percentage of assault related offenses that resulted in injury has fluctuated substantially from year to year.

**Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners, and most often involved single-officer vehicles.** Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners accounted for 41-65% of assaults against officers in the county during the 2020 through 2024 period.

**Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers in the county.** During the period 2020 through 2024, an average of 75% of assaults against officers involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as weapons. Assaults during this period that involved the use of a firearm, or a cutting instrument accounted for an average of 5% of the total offenses.

## Law Enforcement Officers Killed and Assaulted in Sussex County

Assault-related offenses committed against law enforcement officers in the county in 2024 (97) were down 11% from 2020, and the total was the lowest of the five-year report period. One-third of assaults in 2024 led to an injury. Trends in assaults against officers in the county since 2013 can be seen in Figure 31.

**The majority of assault-related offenses (92.8%) had been cleared before the end of 2024.** Assaults against officers in the county continue to be cleared at rates averaging 96%.

**No officers were killed in 2024 with 33% of Assault offenses resulting in officer injuries.** There were no attempted homicides of an officer in 2024.

**Most assault-related offenses occurred while responding to disturbances, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners, and most often involved single-officer vehicles.** Responding to a disturbance, attempting an arrest, and handling prisoners generally accounted for between 55 and 70% of assaults against officers in the county during the 2020 through 2024 period.

**Guns and bladed instruments were used infrequently during assaults on officers in the county.** During the period 2020 through 2024, an average of 80.2% of assaults against officers involved the use of hands, fists, or feet as a weapon. Assaults during this period that involved the use of a firearm or cutting instrument were very infrequent, averaging just over 3% from 2020 to 2024.

\*Fluctuations in Special Agency Officer and Total Officer counts during five-year report period are largely due to variations in the frequency and consistency in which Amtrak has reported its data. Amtrak values for 2020 were problematic to such a degree that they substantially distorted the change in Officer comparison for 2020 to 2024. As a result, 2020 Amtrak counts were adjusted from 403 officers and 59 civilians to 29 officers and 26 civilians. This change also lowered the Special Agency and overall totals by 374 officers and 33 civilians.

# TECHNICAL APPENDIX

## Detailed Explanation of Clearance Rates

In crime analysis, criminal offenses are considered to be 'solved' through either an arrest or through an alternative means when a suspect(s) has been identified but an arrest cannot be made. When an offense is solved in this way, it is considered to have been 'cleared' for crime reporting purposes. The federal definition of *clearance rate* is the percentage of offenses received that are 'solved' through an arrest or by exceptional means. An offense is 'cleared by arrest' for crime reporting purposes when at least one person is arrested, charged with the commission of the offense, and turned over to a court for prosecution.

In certain situations, an offender cannot be arrested and formally charged. When this happens, the offense can be cleared by *exceptional means*. This type of clearance can be made if the following four conditions are met:

- the offender can be identified.
- there is enough evidence to support an arrest, make a charge, and turn the offender over to a court for prosecution.
- the offender's exact location is known so that the suspect could be taken into custody immediately.
- there are circumstances outside the control of law enforcement that prohibits the agency from arresting, charging, and prosecuting the offender.

Examples of exceptional clearances include, but are not limited to:

- the death of the offender.
- confession of the offender under circumstances where prosecution is not possible (e.g., a death bed confession, a confession made while serving a life sentence in another jurisdiction and extradition for trial is not possible).
- the refusal of a victim to cooperate with the prosecution after the offender has been identified.
- denial of extradition (e.g., because the offender committed a crime in another jurisdiction and is being prosecuted for that offense).
- The handling of minor juvenile offenses outside of juvenile court as a matter of publicly accepted police policy.

### ***Clearances involving only persons under 18 years of age***

When a juvenile offender is cited to appear in juvenile court or before other juvenile authorities, the FBI considers the incident in question to be cleared by arrest, even though a physical arrest may not have occurred. When clearances involve juvenile and adult offenders, those incidents are classified by the FBI as clearances for crimes committed by adults. Since clearance percentages for crimes involving juvenile offenders only include clearances where an adult was not also involved, juvenile clearance figures should be interpreted with caution—they do not present a definitive picture of juvenile involvement in crime.

### ***Some Factors that Affect Clearance Rates***

*Single versus Multiple Offenses:* In some situations, an offender may commit multiple criminal offenses, either in a single incident of crime or over several incidents. In other situations, two or more people may commit a single offense during a single criminal incident. These situations each work differently with respect to clearances. In the first example, the arrest or identification of that person can clear multiple offenses, while in the second example, the arrest or identification of several persons would only clear one offense.

*The Nature of Some Types of Crime:* Violent Criminal Offenses (Murder, Forcible Rape, Robbery, and Aggravated Assault) often undergo a more intensive investigative effort than crimes against property. Also, victims and/or witnesses often identify the perpetrators. Property crimes such as theft from a motor vehicle or vandalism often occur in the absence of witnesses, making it more difficult to identify suspects. Consequently, Violent Offenses tend to have higher clearance rates than Property Offenses. Drug/Narcotic offenses clear at high rates because of the nature of those crimes and how they come to the attention of law enforcement agencies.

Involuntary Servitude	Obtaining a person(s) through recruitment, harboring, transportation, or provision, and subjecting such persons by force, fraud, or coercion into voluntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery (not to include commercial sex acts)
<i>Larceny-Theft Offenses</i>	The unlawful taking, carrying, leading, or riding away of property from the possession, or constructive possession, of another person.
Pocket-Picking	The theft of articles from another person's physical possession by stealth where the victim usually does not become immediately aware of the theft.
Purse-Snatching	The grabbing or snatching of a purse, handbag, etc., from the physical possession of another person.
Shoplifting	The theft, by someone other than an employee of the victim, of goods or merchandise exposed for sale.
Theft from Motor Vehicle	The theft of articles from a motor vehicle, whether locked or unlocked.
Theft of Motor Vehicle Parts or Accessories	The theft of any part or accessory affixed to the interior or exterior of a motor vehicle in a manner which would make the item an attachment of the vehicle or necessary for its operation.
Theft from Building	A theft from within a building which is either open to the general public or where the offender has legal access.
Theft from a Coin-Operated Machine or Device	A theft from a machine or device which is operated or activated by the use of coins.
All Other Larceny	All thefts which do not fit any of the definitions of the specific subcategories of Larceny/Theft listed above.
Motor Vehicle Theft	The theft (or attempted theft) of a motor vehicle by person(s) without lawful access to the vehicle.
Pornography/ Obscene Material	The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, publishing, sale, purchase, or possession of sexually explicit material, e.g., literature, photographs, etc.

Prostitution	To unlawfully engage in sexual relations for profit. This offense includes prostitution by both males and females.
Assisting or Promoting Prostitution	To solicit customers or transport persons for prostitution purposes; to own, manage, or operate a dwelling or other establishment for the

	purpose of providing a place where prostitution is performed; or to otherwise assist or promote prostitution.
Robbery	Feloniously taking or attempting to take anything of value from someone by force, threat of force, violence, and/or by putting the victim in fear.
<i>Sex Offenses, Forcible</i>	Any sexual act directed against another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent.
Forcible Rape	The carnal knowledge of a person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity (or because of his/her youth).
Forcible Sodomy	Oral or anal sexual intercourse with another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.
Sexual Assault with an Object	To use an object or instrument to unlawfully penetrate, however slightly, the genital or anal opening of the body of another person, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of his/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity. An "object" or "instrument" is anything used by the offender other than the offender's genitalia.
Forcible Fondling	The touching of the private body parts of another person for the purpose of sexual gratification, forcibly and/or against that person's will; or not forcibly or against the person's will where the victim is incapable of giving consent because of this/her youth or because of his/her temporary or permanent mental or physical incapacity.
<i>Sex Offenses, Non-Forcible</i>	Unlawful, non-forcible sexual intercourse.
Incest	Non-forcible sexual intercourse between persons who are related to each other within the degrees wherein marriage is prohibited by law.
Statutory Rape	Non-forcible sexual intercourse with a person who is under the statutory age of consent.
Stolen Property Offenses	Receiving, buying, selling, possessing, concealing, or transporting any property with the knowledge that it has been unlawfully taken, as by burglary, embezzlement, fraud, larceny, robbery, etc.
Weapon Law Violations	The violation of laws or ordinances prohibiting the manufacture, sale, purchase, transportation, possession, concealment, or use of firearms, cutting instruments, explosives, incendiary devices, or other deadly weapons. Includes violations such as the manufacture, sale, or possession of deadly weapons; carrying deadly weapons, concealed or openly; using, manufacturing, etc. silencers; and furnishing deadly weapons to minors.

<i>Cruelty To Animals</i>	Intentionally, knowingly, or recklessly taking an action that mistreats or kills any animal without just cause, such as torturing, tormenting, mutilation, maiming, poisoning, or abandonment
All Other Offenses	All crimes which are not Group-A offenses and not included in one of the specifically named Group B crime categories listed above. Offenses of general applicability (i.e., any offense prefixed by "accessory before/after the fact", "aiding and abetting", "attempt to commit", "conspiracy to commit", "facilitation of", "solicitation to commit", "threat to commit", or any other prefix identifying it as other than the substantive offense) are included in this category, if the substantive offense is within Group A.
